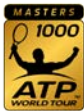

FEDERER AND DEL POTRO TO FACE OFF FOR CHAMPIONSHIP

- The BNP Paribas Open will come to its conclusion on Sunday with a singles championship match pitting five-time champion and No. 1 seed **Roger Federer** of Switzerland against two-time finalist and No. 6 seed **Juan Martin del Potro** of Argentina. Federer will attempt to claim the 28th ATP Masters 1000 title of his career, while Del Potro is seeking his first.
- Federer has an 18-6 lead in the head-to-head record, including 13-6 on hard courts. Federer also won their lone previous meeting at the BNP Paribas Open, a 6-3 6-2 victory in the quarterfinals in 2012. Federer has also won all seven of their previous matches at ATP Masters 1000 events, and went 3-1 against Del Potro last year, including winning their two most recent matches. Del Potro, however, leads the head-to-head in Tour-level finals by 3-2, all of which took place on hard court.
- Defending champion **Federer** has reached the Indian Wells final for the fourth straight time (he did not play in 2016) and eighth overall (5-2 in finals). A win in the 2018 championship match would give him a sixth BNP Paribas Open title, garnering him sole possession of the record for most titles in Indian Wells (currently tied with Djokovic). This is the first time Federer has opened a season 17-0 (he started 2006 with a 16-0 record), clinching titles at the Australian Open and Rotterdam before his five wins here. He has also won 40 of 44 sets this season, and had not dropped a set en route to the semi-finals. The World No. 1 survived a three-set battle in his semi-final match against Borna Coric, as the 21-year-old Croat led 7-5 4-2 and was twice up a break in the third set before Federer rallied for a 5-7 6-4 6-4 triumph. Federer is trying to become the first three-time singles titlist on the ATP World Tour this season, and will retain his No. 1 ranking going into the next event at Miami.
- **Del Potro** is into his first Indian Wells final since 2013: during that run, he defeated current tournament director and No. 19 Tommy Haas in the fourth round, No. 3 Andy Murray in the quarterfinals, and No. 1 Novak Djokovic in the semi-finals, before falling to Rafael Nadal in the title match. Del Potro is still looking for his first ATP Masters 1000 title; his other runner-up showings were at Montreal in 2009 (lost to Murray) and Shanghai in 2013 (lost to Djokovic). The Argentine came through three-set battles with compatriot Leonardo Mayer in the fourth round and Philipp Kohlschreiber in the quarterfinals before dispatching Milos Raonic in straight sets in the semi-finals, and is now on a ten-match winning streak, having won the Acapulco title in his previous event. A win would make Del Potro the first Argentine to claim the Indian Wells title in tournament history (since 1976) and the first South American titlist here since Chile's Marcelo Rios in 1998.
- Federer, Nadal, and Djokovic have accounted for 13 of the past 14 Indian Wells titles, dating back to 2004, when Federer captured the first of his five titles. The only exception in that timeframe occurred in 2010, when Croatia's Ivan Ljubicic clinched the championship.

FEDERER-CORIC, RAONIC-DEL POTRO COLLIDE IN SEMI-FINALS

- The BNP Paribas Open semi-finals on Saturday feature World No. 1 and five-time champion **Roger Federer**, No. 6 seed and 2013 finalist **Juan Martin del Potro**, No. 32 seed and 2016 finalist **Milos Raonic** and unseeded **Borna Coric**. Federer has 27 career ATP Masters 1000 titles and the other three players are trying to earn their first ATP Masters 1000 crown.
- In the first match, **Federer** and **Coric** meet for the second time. In their previous meeting in the semi-finals at 2015 Dubai, Federer won 62 61. Federer is looking to start 17-0 for the first time in his career. He has won 38 of 41 sets this season. This is his best start to a season since 2006 when he went 16-0 en route to a 92-5 finish. The 36-year-old Swiss superstar has not dropped a set (8-0) en route to his 11th Indian Wells semi-final (7-3) and he's won his last four SFs here since losing in 2011 to Djokovic. Federer, who leads the tournament in service games won (38 of 40, 95%), is trying to reach the Indian Wells final for the fourth straight time (did not play in 2016) and eighth overall (5-2). He won last year's title and was runner-up in 2014-15 (l. to Djokovic in both). The 21-year-old Coric, who is appearing in his first ATP Masters 1000 semi-final, is the first unseeded semi-finalist here since Del Potro in 2011 and the first Croat to reach the Indian Wells semi-finals since Ivan Ljubicic won the 2010 title. Coric leads the tournament with 23 return games won. He will climb from No. 49 to No. 36 and to a career-high No. 27 if he reaches the final.
- In the next match on, former Indian Wells finalists **Raonic** and **Del Potro** square off for the fourth time. Raonic owns a 2-1 head-to-head advantage, winning the last meeting in the SFs of Delray Beach last year. In 2013, they split their two meetings with Raonic winning on home soil at ATP Masters 1000 Montreal and Del Potro prevailing in the Tokyo final. Both players are trying to reach their fourth career ATP Masters 1000 final and capture their first crown (0-3). Raonic, who was runner-up here two years ago (l. to Djokovic), is appearing in his first ATP Masters 1000 semi-final since 2016 Paris. This is his third Indian Wells semi-final (also in 2015). The 27-year-old Canadian will jump from No. 38 to No. 25 in the ATP Rankings and will move to No. 22 if he reaches his fourth ATP Masters 1000 final (0-3). The 29-year-old Del Potro, who reached the 2013 Indian Wells final (l. to Nadal), comes in on a nine-match winning streak after his Acapulco title. This is Del Potro's third Indian Wells semi-final, first since his runner-up five years ago. He also advanced to the semi-finals in 2011. He has 399 career wins and he is trying to join Guillermo Vilas (929) as the only Argentines in the 400 Wins Club.
- In the all-American doubles championship, **John Isner** and **Jack Sock** take on No. 7 seeds **Bob and Mike Bryan**. This is the second all-American doubles final in tournament history (since 1976), the first since 1981 when **Bruce Manson** and **Brian Teacher** beat **Terry Moor** and **Eliot Teltscher** in nearby LaQuinta. It is also the first all-American ATP Masters1000 final since 2011 Rome where **Isner** and **Sam Querrey** won the title by walkover against **Mardy Fish** and **Andy Roddick**.

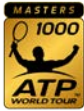

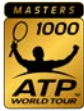

- This is the second all-American doubles championship in tournament history (since 1976), the first since 1981 when **Bruce Manson** and **Brian Teacher** defeated **Terry Moor** and **Eliot Teltscher** in nearby LaQuinta. It is also the first all-American ATP Masters 1000 final since 2011 Rome where **John Isner** and **Sam Querrey** won the title by walkover against **Mardy Fish** and **Andy Roddick**.

- **Isner** and **Sock** have not lost a set (6-0) en route to their third (1-1) career ATP World Tour final together. Both of their previous finals came in China. In 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai they defeated Kontinen/Peers 64 64 in the final and last year in Beijing they lost to Kontinen/Peers

- This is his third Indian Wells final in four years. He won the 2015 title (d. Bolelli/Fognini) and was runner-up in 2016 (l. to Herbert/Mahut), both with Pospisil. Playing doubles here for fourth straight year (12-2 record)

- **Bryan** and **Bryan** have only dropped one set (8-1) in the tournament, that coming in 1R to Zverev brothers, en route to their second final of the season. In their last tournament in Acapulco they were finalists (l. to J. Murray/Soares)

They have won 16 Grand Slam doubles titles (last 2014 US Open) and 36 ATP Masters 1000 titles (last 2016 Rome), both team records

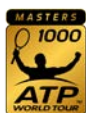

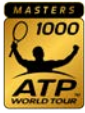

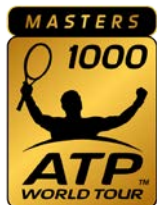

QUERREY-RAONIC AND DEL POTRO-KOHLSCHEIBER SQUARE OFF

- The quarter-finals in the bottom half of the BNP Paribas Open draw on Friday are led by two former Indian Wells finalists, No. 6 seed **Juan Martin del Potro** and No. 32 seed **Milos Raonic** along with two first-time quarter-finalists No. 18 seed **Sam Querrey** and No. 31 seed **Philipp Kohlschreiber**. Both players are also trying to reach their first career ATP Masters 1000 semi-final.
- In the first singles match, **Querrey** and **Raonic** meet for the fifth time (tied 2-2). Querrey won the first two meetings in 2012 before Raonic has won the last two, in 2013 San Jose and 2016 Wimbledon. Querrey is making his fourth career ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final showing, his first since 2012 Paris. Querrey is appearing in Indian Wells for the 13th year in a row and if he reaches the semi-finals, the 30-year-old American will break the Top 10 in the ATP Rankings at No. 10 for the first time in his career. Querrey came in ranked No. 21 and has moved up to No. 14 so far. Raonic who reached the final here two years ago (l. to Djokovic), has jumped from No. 38 to No. 29 and will improve to No. 25 if he reaches the semi-finals. The 27-year-old Canadian is trying to reach his third Indian Wells semi-final (also in 2015).
- In next match, **Del Potro** brings a 6-2 head-to-head (5-0 on hard courts) advantage against **Kohlschreiber**, who has won the past two meetings in 2016 in Munich on clay and Stuttgart on grass. Del Potro, who reached the 2013 Indian Wells final (l. to Nadal), comes in on an eight-match winning streak after his Acapulco title. This is Del Potro's fifth Indian Wells quarter-final (2-2), the first in five years. He also advanced to the semi-finals in 2011. Kohlschreiber, who beat World No. 3 Cilic in the 3R, is the first German in the QFs here since current tournament director Tommy Haas in 2008. The last German to reach the semi-finals was Rainer Schuettler in 2003 (l. to Kuerten). The 33-year-old German is playing in his fifth ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final, his first since 2010 Toronto. This is his 83rd ATP Masters 1000 tournament.
- The doubles semi-finals feature **Pablo Cuevas** and **Horacio Zeballos** against No. 7 seeds **Bob and Mike Bryan** in the last day session match on Stadium 1. On Stadium 2, **John Isner** and **Jack Sock** take on No. 3 seeds **Oliver Marach** and **Mate Pavic**, who are the current No. 1 duo in the ATP Doubles Team Rankings. Both teams have not lost a set in the tournament.

- The top half quarter-finals of the BNP Paribas Open on Thursday feature World No. 1 and five-time Indian Wells champion **Roger Federer**, No. 7 seed **Kevin Anderson** along with two 21-year-old young stars on the ATP World Tour, No. 23 seed **Hyeon Chung** and unseeded **Borna Coric**. The quarter-finals in the bottom half of the draw will be played on Friday.
- In the day session match, **Coric** looks for his first win (0-3) against **Anderson** who has won all previous seven sets against the Croat. In their last meeting in the 3R at the US Open, Anderson won 64 63 62 en route to his first Grand Slam final. Coric is appearing in his third career ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final (2016 Cincinnati, 2017 Madrid) and he's trying to reach his first semi-final. He leads the tournament in return games won (21 of 38, 55%) while Anderson is the tourney leader in aces (55) and service games won (38 of 39, 97%). The 31-year-old South African is also trying to advance to his first ATP Masters 1000 semi-final. He is 0-8 in Masters 1000 quarter-final matches with seven of the losses coming to Top 10 opponents. Coric is ranked No. 49.
- In the night session, **Federer** meets **Chung** for the second time. In their previous meeting in the semi-finals at the Australian Open on Jan. 26, Federer was leading 61 5-2 when the South Korean native retired with a foot blister. Federer comes in with a 15-0 match record, his best start to a season since 2006 when he went 16-0. The 36-year-old Swiss superstar is appearing in his 12th Indian Wells quarter-final and he registered his 60th tournament win on Wednesday over Jeremy Chardy. Federer is 10-1 in QF matches here with his lone loss coming to Nadal in 2013. That was also the last year Federer didn't reach the Indian Wells final. He was runner-up in 2014-15, did not play in 2016 and won his fifth title last year. Chung, who won last year's inaugural Next Gen ATP Finals in Milan, enters with a 15-5 match record on the season and he is appearing in his fifth quarter-final in sixth tournament in 2018. He is looking to earn his second career Top 10 win (1-10). In January he defeated No. 4 A. Zverev in the 3R at the Australian Open. On Monday, he will become the top Asian player in the ATP Rankings, replacing Kei Nishikori who has held the top spot every week since July 25, 2011.
- There are two doubles quarter-finals on the schedule with No. 3 seeds **Oliver Marach** and **Mate Pavic** taking on **Feliciano Lopez** and **Marc Lopez** in the final match of the night session on Stadium 1. In the last match on Stadium 2, **Pablo Cuevas** and **Horacio Zeballos** meet **Gilles Muller** and **Sam Querrey**, who is also left in the singles quarter-finals. He is the only player remaining in both singles and doubles draws.

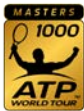

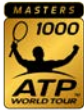

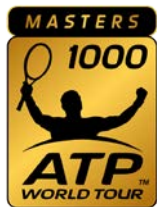

FEDERER LOOKS TO REMAIN UNBEATEN, LEADS 4TH ROUND LINE-UP

- World No. 1 and reigning BNP Paribas Open champion **Roger Federer** is joined by No. 6 seed **Juan Martin del Potro** and No. 7 **Kevin Anderson** in Wednesday's fourth round action at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Of the remaining 16 players, Federer is the lone former champion and Del Potro and No. 32 seed **Milos Raonic** are former Indian Wells finalists.
- Leading off the Stadium 1 schedule is 20-year-old #NextGenATP American **Taylor Fritz** against 21-year-old Croat **Borna Coric**, who won the only previous meeting at Roland Garros in 2016. They are the two youngest players remaining. Fritz is one of two Americans left (Querrey) and he is trying to advance to his first ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final. Coric, who has lost only nine games in three matches, is looking to reach his third career ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final.
- In the next match on, **Federer** brings a 3-1 head-to-head record (2-0 on hard courts) against Frenchman **Jeremy Chardy**, who is appearing in the 4R here for the first time in 10 visits. Federer comes in with a 14-0 match record, his best start to a season since 2006 when he went 16-0. The 36-year-old Swiss superstar is attempting to reach his 12th Indian Wells quarter-final and register his 60th tournament win (59-11).
- In the final day session match, **Del Potro** meets countryman **Leonardo Mayer**, who is trying to reach his first ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final. Del Potro won the only previous tour level meeting at the 2012 US Open. He also won two Futures meetings on home soil in 2005. Del Potro, who reached the 2013 Indian Wells final, comes in on a seven-match winning streak after his Acapulco title. Mayer is 1-26 lifetime against Top 10 opponents, having lost 10 in a row since his lone win over No. 7 Ferrer in the 2014 Hamburg final.
- In the night session, qualifier **Marcos Baghdatis** takes on **Raonic**, who holds a 3-1 head-to-head advantage. The 32-year-old Cypriot is the lowest-ranked player remaining at No. 102 and he is trying to reach his first ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final since 2010 Cincinnati (SF). Raonic, who reached the final here two years ago, is trying to reach the QFs for the fourth time.
- On Stadium 2, No. 23 seed and last year's Next Gen ATP Finals champion **Hyeon Chung** plays No. 30 **Pablo Cuevas** for the first time. Chung is trying to reach his first ATP Masters 1000 QF and Cuevas is looking to return to the quarter-finals for the second straight year. Next on is Frenchman **Pierre-Hugues Herbert** against No. 31 seed **Philipp Kohlschreiber**, who has won three of the previous four meetings. Herbert is eyeing his maiden ATP Masters 1000 singles quarter-final while Kohlschreiber is looking to become the first German in the QFs here since Tommy Haas in 2008. In the next match, No. 11 **Pablo Carreno Busta** and **Anderson** meet for the first time since last year's US Open semi-final encounter won by the South African in four sets. Overall Anderson leads the head-to-head meetings 3-0. Anderson is the only player yet to lose serve (23 games held). In the final match on, No. 28 **Feliciano Lopez** brings a 6-4 head-to-head record against No. 18 **Sam Querrey**, who has won the last two meetings. Lopez, who is playing here for the 16th straight year, is trying to reach his second quarter-final (2015). Querrey, appearing for the 13th year in a row, is looking to advance to his first quarter-final in the desert.

CILIC, DEL POTRO, SOCK HEADLINE STADIUM 1 ORDER OF PLAY

- The three highest seeds remaining in the bottom half of the BNP Paribas Open draw are featured on Stadium 1 Tuesday, led by No. 2 **Marin Cilic** No. 6 **Juan Martin del Potro**, and No. 8 **Jack Sock**. There are three other singles matches on Stadium 2 and two on Stadium 3.
- In the second match on Stadium 1, No. 31 seed **Philipp Kohlschreiber** brings a 6-4 head-to-head record (4-2 on hard courts) against **Cilic**, who won the last meeting in straight sets in the 1R of Wimbledon last year. The No. 2 German is trying to reach the 4R in Indian Wells for the third time, the first since 2011. He has a 22-87 career record vs. Top 10 opponents and trying to break a 12-match losing streak since defeating No. 7 Berdych in a 1R Davis Cup tie in 2016. Cilic is trying to advance to the 4R here for the third time in 11 appearances. He reached the QFs in 2016.
- In the next match on, **Del Potro** and No. 29 **David Ferrer** resume their rivalry which began 10 years ago. This is their 13th overall meeting (tied 6-6) and third this season. The Argentine has won the past four matches going back to the 2013 Wimbledon QFs. In their last tournament in Acapulco, Del Potro prevailed in three sets in the 2R en route to the title. Del Potro, who reached the 2013 Indian Wells final, is looking for his 20th career win here (19-7). Ferrer is trying to even his Indian Wells record (11-12) and reach the 4R for the third time (2007 QF, 2009 4R).
- In the evening session, No.1 American **Sock** takes 2-1 head-to-head record against No. 28 **Feliciano Lopez**, who is one of three Spaniards remaining. Sock, who reached the semi-finals here last year (l. to Federer), is trying to win back-to-back matches (2-4) for the first time this season. Lopez is making his 16th straight Indian Wells appearance and he has reached the 4R three times (4R in 2014 and 2016, QF in 2015).
- On Stadium 2, Frenchmen **Gael Monfils** and **Pierre-Hugues Herbert** meet for the first time. Monfils, who reached the QFs two years ago, has a 7-2 record here since 2016 after going 3-7 in his first seven appearances. Herbert is playing in the 3R for the first time. In the next men's match, No. 32 seed and 2016 Indian Wells finalist **Milos Raonic** looks to remain unbeaten (3-0) against Portugal's **Joao Sousa**, who upset No. 5-ranked Alexander Zverev on Sunday. In the final singles match on, qualifier **Marcos Baghdatis** and lucky loser **Dudi Sela** meet for the third time in a main draw. The Cypriot has won both previous meetings.
- On Stadium 3, **Leonardo Mayer** of Argentina plays Japanese qualifier **Taro Daniel** for the first time on the ATP World Tour. Daniel won the previous meeting in the Buenos Aires Challenger last year. Daniel is coming off his biggest career win over No. 13-ranked Djokovic on Sunday. In the final match, No. 18 **Sam Querrey** takes on Indian qualifier **Yuki Bhambri** for the first time. Querrey is playing here for the 13th straight year and he's trying to reach the 4R for the third time (2011, 2013). Bhambri is the first Indian to reach the 3R here since Somdev Devvarman, who advanced to the 4R in 2011. The three qualifiers in the 3R here are the most since 2011.

WORLD NO. 1 ROGER FEDERER KICKS OFF INDIAN WELLS THIRD ROUND

- Five-time and defending BNP Paribas Open champion and World No. 1 **Roger Federer** opens third-round play on Monday in Indian Wells. **Dominic Thiem** and **Kevin Anderson** are other Top 10 stars in action, as the players in the top half of the draw attempt to advance to the round of 16.
- Federer will step onto Stadium 1 for the third straight day when he takes on the No. 25 seed, **Filip Krajinovic** of Serbia. The Swiss superstar was leading Argentina's **Federico Delbonis** 6-3, 2-2 on Saturday night when rain showers forced the remainder of the match to be postponed to Sunday. The Argentine left-hander, who had beaten Federer in their only previous match, pushed the top seed to a second-set tiebreak yesterday, but the World No. 1 ultimately prevailed in straight sets. Another stern test awaits Federer, as Krajinovic is currently at a career-high ranking of No. 28, and reached the final of his most recent ATP Masters 1000 event, in Paris at the end of last year.
- The next match on Stadium 1 will pit Spain's **Fernando Verdasco** against #NextGenATP American **Taylor Fritz**. 20-year-old Fritz had to oust two other 20-year-olds to get to the third round: his countryman and friend **Reilly Opelka** in the first round, and 27th-seeded Russian **Andrey Rublev** in the second round. Fritz will now face a veteran in the third round, and 34-year-old Verdasco has been in fine form in 2018. The Spaniard reached the final at Rio de Janeiro last month, and claimed the 13th Top 5 win of his career over No. 4 **Grigor Dimitrov** in the second round here on Saturday.
- The evening encounter on Stadium 1 sees 12th-seeded Czech **Tomas Berdych** up against Korean No. 23 seed **Hyeon Chung**. The Czech is at the BNP Paribas Open for the 14th straight year, and the 2013 Indian Wells semi-finalist is playing well this year, reaching the quarter-finals or better at three of his four prior events, including the Australian Open. Chung quite famously went far at the 2018 Australian Open as well, becoming the first-ever Korean Grand Slam semi-finalist.
- Monday's first match on Stadium 2 has No. 13 seed **Roberto Bautista Agut** of Spain squaring off against Croatia's **Borna Coric**. They have met five times already, with the Spaniard claiming four wins, including in the quarter-finals at Dubai just two weeks ago. After that match, No. 5-seeded Thiem of Austria takes on No. 30 seed **Pablo Cuevas** of Uruguay. Thiem and Cuevas both made the BNP Paribas Open quarter-finals last year. They played twice in 2017, with the Austrian winning both matches.
- Three singles matches on Stadium 3 round out Monday's third-round matchups. First, No. 20 seed **Adrian Mannarino** meets fellow Frenchman **Jeremy Chardy**. Chardy has dominated their history, winning all three of their Tour-level meetings. Next, No. 11 seed **Pablo Carreno Busta** of Spain will face Russia's **Daniil Medvedev**. Carreno Busta made his maiden ATP Masters 1000 semi-final here last year, but the Russian came out on top in their only prior meeting. Finally, 7th-seeded Anderson of South Africa plays Argentine **Nicolas Kicker**. 2017 US Open finalist Anderson is aiming to better his BNP Paribas Open quarter-final showings from 2013 and 2014, while Kicker has had a smashing tournament debut this year at Indian Wells by making the third round.

5-TIME CHAMP DJOKOVIC HITS THE COURT IN INDIAN WELLS 2018 OPENER

- Five-time BNP Paribas Open champion and No. 10 seed **Novak Djokovic** is part of a host of Top 10 seeds kicking off their Indian Wells campaigns on Sunday, including No. 2 seed **Marin Cilic**, No. 4 seed **Alexander Zverev**, No. 6 seed **Juan Martin del Potro**, and No. 8 seed and top-ranked American **Jack Sock**. Top seed **Roger Federer** will also resume his rain-interrupted second round.
- Play starts on Stadium 1 with Djokovic facing Japanese qualifier **Taro Daniel** as his first test in Indian Wells this year. Djokovic has only played the Australian Open so far this year; there, the 6-time champion in Melbourne fell to surging semi-finalist **Hyeon Chung** in the fourth round. The former World No. 1 from Serbia continues to cautiously return to the ATP World Tour after stopping his 2017 season following Wimbledon, due to a right elbow injury. Daniel was winless at Tour level this season prior to Indian Wells, but comes into the second-round match having finally picked up a victory over fellow qualifier **Cameron Norrie**.
- No. 1 seed **Roger Federer** will then resume his match against Argentine left-hander **Federico Delbonis**. Delbonis won their only previous meeting at 2013 Hamburg, but Federer opened up a 6-3, 2-2 lead last night before persistent rain interrupted and postponed play. This is the first time Federer comes into Indian Wells ranked No. 1 since 2010. The five-time Indian Wells champion is 57-11 and this is his 17th tournament appearance. Delbonis is 3-8 lifetime against Top 10 opponents, and his last win came over No. 2 Andy Murray here in the third round two years ago.
- The remaining day session match on Stadium 1 features American No. 1 Sock squaring off against Italy's **Thomas Fabbiano**. After finishing last season by winning his first ATP Masters 1000 event in Paris and reaching the semi-finals of the Nitto ATP Finals, Sock has started 2018 slowly, having only picked up one win so far this year. Like Sock, Fabbiano opened the year with a 1-4 win/loss record, but claimed a second win over American wild card **Bradley Klahn** in the first round.
- Del Potro will hit Stadium 1 for the night session as he takes on #NextGenATP sensation **Alex de Minaur** of Australia. The 19-year-old Australian made a splash at the start of the year, reaching the semi-finals in Brisbane as a wild card, and then following that up with a run to the Sydney final, where he lost to **Daniil Medvedev**. De Minaur, then 18 years old, became the youngest player to reach semi-finals in consecutive weeks since 18-year-old Rafael Nadal achieved the feat at Monte Carlo and Barcelona in 2005. Del Potro, however, is in strong form, having just beaten three of his fellow Top 10 players consecutively en route to his 21st career ATP World Tour title at Acapulco.
- Stadium 2 play opens on Sunday when No. 15-seeded American **John Isner** battles France's **Gael Monfils**. The Frenchman has a 5-4 head-to-head edge over the 2012 BNP Paribas Open runner-up during the decade-long history between the two. That match will be followed by Cilic's encounter with **Marton Fucsovics**, who became the first Hungarian to make a Grand Slam fourth-round in 34 years when he did so at the Australian Open. Cilic, of course, made his third career Grand Slam final in Melbourne. Finally, Zverev will attempt to advance to the Indian Wells third round for the third straight year as he meets Portugal's **Joao Sousa**.



- Stadium 3 is packed with four singles matches on Sunday. American wild card **Tennys Sandgren** meets No. 29 seed **David Ferrer** of Spain, No. 22 seed **Kei Nishikori** of Japan takes on **Leonardo Mayer** of Argentina, and American No. 18 seed **Sam Querrey** faces German **Mischa Zverev**, the elder of the Zverev brothers. Finally, Canadian No. 32 seed **Milos Raonic** will meet his 17-year-old countryman **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, after the #NextGenATP player claimed his first ATP World Tour main draw win in the first round over another Canadian, **Vasek Pospisil**.

TOP 10 SEEDS FEDERER, DIMITROV, THIEM, ANDERSON IN ACTION

- Second round play in the top half of the BNP Paribas Open draw on Saturday is headlined by World No. 1 and reigning champion **Roger Federer** along with No. 3 seed **Grigor Dimitrov**, No. 5 **Dominic Thiem** and No. 7 **Kevin Anderson**.
- The opening match on Stadium 1 features #NextGenATP Greek teenager **Stefanos Tsitsipas** against **Thiem**, who won the only previous meeting 75-64 in the quarter-finals of Doha back in the opening week of the season. The 19-year-old Tsitsipas, who is ranked a career-high No. 71 this week, is looking for his second career Top 10 win after beating No. 10 David Goffin last October in Antwerp. Thiem leads the ATP World Tour this season with 16 match wins and he captured his ninth career ATP World Tour title in Buenos Aires last month.
- In the final day session match, **Dimitrov** takes a 2-1 head-to-head advantage against former World No. 7 **Fernando Verdasco**. All three of their previous meetings have been decided in three sets. Dimitrov has never been past the third round in Indian Wells and he is trying to even his career record (5-6) in the tournament. Verdasco is playing in Indian Wells for the 15th straight year and he is trying to earn his second Top 10 win in 10 attempts here (1-8).
- In the evening session, **Federer** enters with a 12-0 record on the season against Argentine left-hander **Federico Delbonis**, who won the only previous meeting at 2013 Hamburg. This is the first time Federer comes into Indian Wells ranked No. 1 since 2010. The five-time Indian Wells champion is 57-11 and this is his 17th tournament appearance. Delbonis is 3-8 lifetime against Top 10 opponents and his last win came over No. 2 Murray here in the third round two years ago.
- In the opening match on Stadium 2, No. 12 seed **Tomas Berdych** takes on German **Maximilian Marterer** for the first time. Berdych is another familiar face in the desert and this is the Czech's 14th straight tournament appearance. Next on is No. 30 seed **Pablo Cuevas** against #NextGenATP Canadian star **Denis Shapovalov**. In the third match on, #NextGenATP stars **Taylor Fritz** and No. 27 seed **Andrey Rublev** meet for the first time. In the final match on that court, a first round doubles contest features **Bob** and **Mike Bryan** against **Alexander** and **Mischa Zverev**. The Bryans, who won the 2013-14 titles, are making their 20th consecutive tournament appearance.
- There are three singles matches on Stadium 3 with No. 16 seed **Fabio Fognini**, No. 13 **Roberto Bautista Agut** and No. 23 **Hyeon Chung**, last year's Next Gen ATP Finals champion, leading the way. Rising American **Jared Donaldson** looks for his second win against Bautista Agut.

MONFILS, #NEXT GEN ATP TRIO HEADLINE DAY TWO ACTION

- The remaining 16 first round singles matches in the bottom half of the BNP Paribas Open draw on Friday features former World No. 6 **Gael Monfils** and the trio of #NextGenATP players American **Frances Tiafoe**, Canadian qualifier **Felix Auger-Aliassime** and Aussie wild card **Alex de Minaur**.
- The opening match on Stadium 1 is between **Monfils** and Aussie **Matthew Ebden**. The Frenchman won the only previous meeting in straight sets in the first round at the 2010 Australian Open. This is the first time Monfils comes into Indian Wells unseeded and without a 1R bye since 2008. Monfils opened the season by capturing his seventh career ATP World Tour title in Doha. This is his first tournament on hard courts since the Australian Open. He is coming off four straight weeks in the South American clay court circuit. Ebden is playing in the Indian Wells main draw for the first time since 2014. Two of his three wins this season are over Top 20 opponents. He beat No. 16 John Isner at the Australian Open and No. 11 Sam Querrey in Acapulco, both in the first round.
- In the next match on, **Tiafoe** and countryman **Ernesto Escobedo** square off for the first time on the ATP World Tour. Escobedo won both previous ATP Challenger Tour matches in a third set tie-break in 2016. This is Tiafoe's first tournament since capturing his maiden ATP World Tour title in Delray Beach on Feb. 25. The 20-year-old American is the youngest champion this season. The 21-year-old Escobedo is making his BNP Paribas Open main draw debut. Prior to Indian Wells he posted his first career Top 10 win over No. 10 Jack Sock in Acapulco.
- In the fourth match on Stadium 2, Canadian qualifier **Vasek Pospisil** takes on 17-year-old countryman **Auger-Aliassime** for the first time. This is the fourth time Pospisil has qualified into the Indian Wells main draw in his seventh appearance. Auger-Aliassime is the youngest player in the 96-player field and he is looking for his first career ATP World Tour main draw win (0-2). The winner of this match will face top Canadian/No. 32 seed Milos Raonic in the second round.
- In the third match on Stadium 4, German **Jan-Lennard Struff** faces another teenager, 18-year-old **de Minaur** for the first time. The young Aussie gained attention in the first two weeks of the season on home soil by reaching the semi-finals in Brisbane (l. to Harrison) and the following week advancing to his first ATP World Tour final in Sydney (l. to Medvedev). He also made an impressive Davis Cup debut against World No. 5 Alexander Zverev, falling in a fifth set tie-break.
- First round doubles action gets underway with six matches on the schedule with No. 2 seeds **Henri Kontinen** and **John Peers** leading the way. Top 10 singles players **Juan Martin del Potro** and **Grigor Dimitrov** are also in action. Americans **John Isner** and **Jack Sock** are the last match of night session on Stadium 1 against Spaniards **Albert Ramos-Vinolas** and **Fernando Verdasco**.

10 THINGS TO WATCH IN INDIAN WELLS

- 1) **No. 1 for Now:** Five-time champion **Roger Federer** defends his title and No. 1 ranking when he returns to the BNP Paribas Open. Federer will remain the World No. 1 if he reaches the semi-finals. Otherwise, **Rafael Nadal** reclaims No. 1 on 19 March for the fifth stint and 168th week of his career.
- 2) **Fantastic Fed:** Federer, 36, is the oldest World No. 1 in ATP Rankings history and owns records for the most weeks at No. 1 (306 as of 12 March), years since No. 1 debut (14) and years between stints at No. 1 (5). The Swiss is 64-5 with nine titles since returning in 2017 from a left knee injury.
- 3) **Novak Returns:** Following a "small medical intervention" on his right elbow, **Novak Djokovic** is scheduled to compete for just the second time since Wimbledon. Djokovic lost to **Hyeon Chung** in the Australian Open fourth round on 22 January before undergoing surgery. He is a five-time BNP Paribas Open champion, tied with Federer for the most titles in tournament history (since 1976).
- 4) **Three's the Limit:** After reaching finals at two of the last three Grand Slam events, **Marin Cilic** became the World No. 3. The Croat is the 16th player to be ranked No. 3 since 25 July 2005. Only four players during that span have been in the Top 2 (Federer, Nadal, Djokovic and **Andy Murray**).
- 5) **Breaking Back:** **Juan Martin del Potro** and **Kevin Anderson** have broken back into the Top 10 this season. Del Potro dropped to No. 1,045 before beginning his comeback from three left wrist surgeries in 2016. Anderson fell to No. 80 after spending one week inside the Top 10 in 2015.
- 6) **Delpo On The Rise:** Del Potro is fresh off of winning the title in Acapulco, where he beat three Top 8 players in a row to clinch his first ATP World Tour 500-level trophy since 2013 Basel. Del Potro, who was a 2013 Indian Wells finalist, is now up to No. 8 in the ATP Rankings.
- 7) **Frenchman Eyes Top 10:** No. 1 Frenchman **Lucas Pouille** has reached three finals in the past four tournaments, highlighted by his fifth ATP World Tour title last month in Montpellier. Pouille is at a career-high No. 12 in the ATP Rankings. He comes in with an 11-4 record on the season.
- 8) **#NextGenATP Turns 2:** **Alexander Zverev**, **Frances Tiafoe** and **Taylor Fritz** were 18 when they helped launch #NextGenATP at the 2016 BNP Paribas Open. They are among the hottest players on tour two years later. Zverev is ranked in the Top 5, Tiafoe captured the Delray Beach Open title on 25 February, and Fritz won the Oracle Challenger Series title in Newport Beach on 28 January.
- 9) **Wild Cards:** Four of the five wild cards are Americans: **Ernesto Escobedo**, **Bradley Klahn**, **Reilly Opelka** and **Tennys Sandgren**. Aussie #NextGenATP star **Alex de Minaur**, who reached the Sydney, is the other WC. De Minaur, Escobedo and Sandgren are making their main draw debut.
- 10) **Double Your Fun:** **Oliver Marach** and **Mate Pavic** enter the BNP Paribas Open with an 18-2 record on the season, sweeping doubles titles in January at Doha, Auckland and the Australian Open. Also in the draw are Californians **Bob** and **Mike Bryan**, who will make their 20th consecutive appearance at the BNP Paribas Open. The Bryans won the Indian Wells title in 2013 and 2014.
