FEDERER AIMS FOR 28TH ATP MASTERS 1000 TITLE, THIEM SEEKS FIRST

- Five-time Indian Wells champion **Roger Federer** and first-time Indian Wells finalist **Dominic Thiem** face off for the first ATP Masters 1000 title of the 2019 season in the BNP Paribas Open singles final on Sunday. Federer and Thiem have evenly split their four previous meetings, but Federer has won both of their clashes on hard courts without dropping a set, including their most recent encounter during the round-robin portion of last year's Nitto ATP Finals.
- No. 4 seed Federer moved into his ninth Indian Wells final after longtime rival **Rafael Nadal** had to withdraw prior to their semi-final tilt due to severe right knee pain. Federer still added four match victories this fortnight to his commanding win-loss record at Indian Wells, which now stands at 66-12. The Swiss maestro dropped serve only once during his run to the final, and he leads the entire field in percentage of break points saved, fending off 15 of the 16 break points he faced. Having completed his quest to obtain his 100th career singles title two weeks ago in Dubai, Federer now aims for his 28th ATP Masters 1000 title, which would also make him the first player to earn two singles titles in 2019.
- Meanwhile, No. 7 seed Thiem is seeking a first-ever ATP Masters 1000 title, having two finalist showings at Madrid in the last two seasons as his best prior results at this level. Like Federer, Thiem has been excellent at protecting his serve throughout this event, being broken just twice out of his 46 service games. The Austrian did not lose serve during his semi-final victory over 2016 Indian Wells finalist **Milos Raonic**, and faced only a single break point in that match (in the final game). Thiem's run kickstarts his year after coming into Indian Wells with a 3-4 win-loss record on the season.

- **2019 SINGLES TITLISTS:** **Dominic Thiem** is aiming to become the 19th different singles champion of 19 tour-level events thus far in 2019. That would extend the record already set in 2019 for most tour-level events with different champions to begin a season since the start of the ATP Tour in 1990. **Roger Federer** (2019 Dubai champion) would end the streak at 18 with a victory in the final.

- **FIRST-EVER MASTERS:** **Dominic Thiem** is bidding to become the seventh player to win his first ATP Masters 1000 title over the last 15 series events. The other six are **Alexander Zverev** (2017 Rome), **Grigor Dimitrov** (2017 Cincinnati), **Jack Sock** (2017 Paris), **Juan Martin del Potro** (2018 Indian Wells), **John Isner** (2018 Miami) and **Karen Khachanov** (2018 Paris).

In the 86 ATP Masters 1000 events prior to 2017 Rome, seven players won their first ATP Masters 1000 title: **Andy Murray** (2008 Cincinnati), **Jo-Wilfried Tsonga** (2008 Paris), **Ivan Ljubicic** (2010 Indian Wells), **Robin Soderling** (2010 Paris), **David Ferrer** (2012 Paris), **Stan Wawrinka** (2014 Monte-Carlo) and **Marin Cilic** (2016 Cincinnati).

During the stretch from 2007 Paris through 2017 Madrid, **Novak Djokovic** (28), **Rafael Nadal** (21), **Andy Murray** (14) and **Roger Federer** (12) combined to capture 75 of the 86 ATP Masters 1000 titles (87.2%).

SEMI-FEDAL: FEDERER VS. NADAL XXXIX FOLLOWS RAONIC VS. THIEM

- Fifteen years after their first meeting on an ATP Tour court, **Roger Federer** and **Rafael Nadal** go head-to-head again on Saturday at the same tournament where *Fedal* was born. Federer and Nadal met in doubles at the 2004 BNP Paribas Open two weeks before their first singles encounter at the Miami Open. Nadal won the doubles match, then the singles match, and now owns a 23-15 lead in his singles rivalry with Federer. But the Swiss has turned the tide of late, winning five matches, seven sets and 31 service games in a row against Nadal -- all on hard courts. That includes Federer's 6-2, 6-3 win in the 2017 BNP Paribas Open fourth round, during which he saved the only break point that he faced.
- In the other semi-final, No. 13 seed and 2016 finalist **Milos Raonic** takes a 2-0 head-to-head advantage into his meeting with No. 7 seed **Dominic Thiem**. Raonic is 16-3 in Indian Wells since 2015, reaching the semi-finals or better in each of his last four appearances. However, the Canadian is still seeking his first ATP Tour title since January 2016 in Brisbane. Thiem has won eight titles in that same span. Like Raonic, the Austrian is two wins from his maiden ATP Masters 1000 championship.
- No. 6 seeds and 2017 finalists **Lukasz Kubot** and **Marcelo Melo** will meet **Nikola Pietrangeli** and **Horacio Zeballos** for the doubles title. Twenty of the 32 singles seeds played doubles in Indian Wells, but none reached the final. Kubot and Melo defeated **Novak Djokovic** and **Fabio Fognini** in the semi-finals to eliminate the last remaining singles seeds. The Pole and Brazilian have earned all four of their Indian Wells victories in a match tiebreak. Playing in just their second tournament as a team, the unseeded Pietrangeli and Zeballos rallied from a set down and saved two match points to upset No. 1 doubles seeds and 2016 champions **Pierre-Hugues Herbert** and **Nicolas Mahut** in the second round.

FEDERER, NADAL ONE WIN AWAY FROM INDIAN WELLS SEMI-FEDAL

- **Roger Federer** and **Rafael Nadal** did not meet in 2018. They did not even compete at the same ATP Tour event last season. Seventeen months since their last match-up, the storied rivals will go head-to-head for the 39th time on Saturday if they both win quarter-final matches at the BNP Paribas Open on Friday. Federer faces unseeded **Hubert Hurkacz** and Nadal takes on No. 12 seed **Karen Khachanov**. Neither Federer nor Nadal has dropped a set this week and both men have been broken only once.
- The fourth-seeded Federer has played five fewer sets than Hurkacz, who earned three-set upsets of No. 28 seed **Lucas Pouille**, No. 6 seed **Kei Nishikori** and No. 24 seed **Denis Shapovalov**. Hurkacz, 22, will be playing in his first ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final. Federer is appearing in his 83rd. The 37-year-old Swiss is playing the 1,453rd match of his career, but just his second against a Polish opponent. He beat **Jerzy Janowicz** 6-4, 7-6(2) in the 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Rome quarter-finals.
- The second-seeded Nadal is 5-0 against Khachanov, including a 5-7, 7-5, 7-6(7), 7-6(3) win in four hours, 23 minutes at the 2018 US Open. Despite that loss, Khachanov ended the season by beating four Top-10 players en route to the ATP Masters 1000 Paris title. Nobody has won more ATP Masters 1000 titles than the 33-time champion Nadal, who can also tie or pass Federer for the most ATP Masters 1000 wins. Federer has 367 ATP Masters 1000 wins and Nadal has 365 entering Friday.

19-YEAR-OLD LUCKY LOSER MAKING NAME FOR HIMSELF IN INDIAN WELLS

- **Miomir Kecmanovic** entered the BNP Paribas Open with a 1-4 tour-level record for his career. When he lost to **Marcos Giron** in qualifying, it appeared that he would leave 1-4. Withdrawals by No. 5 seed **Kevin Anderson**, No. 19 seed **Pablo Carreno Busta** and No. 26 seed **Grigor Dimitrov** allowed Kecmanovic to enter the tournament as a lucky loser and receive a first-round bye. The 19-year-old hasn't looked back ever since, sweeping **Maximilian Marterer**, No. 30 seed **Laslo Djere** and **Yoshihito Nishioka** without dropping a set. Kecmanovic is the youngest BNP Paribas Open quarter-finalist since **Michael Chang**, 19, in 1991. The World No. 130 is the lowest-ranked quarter-finalist at Indian Wells since then-No. 239 **Ivo Karlovic** in 2011. He is also the first lucky loser to reach the quarter-finals here since Indian Wells served as the inaugural ATP Masters 1000 event in 1990.
- Kecmanovic's opponent on Thursday is No. 13 seed **Milos Raonic**, who beat him 6-3, 7-6(2) in the Brisbane second round on 2 January. Raonic is 18-4 in Indian Wells since 2014, reaching the quarter-finals or better in each of his last five appearances. The 2016 BNP Paribas Open finalist is three wins from the biggest title of his career. However, the 28-year-old Canadian is appearing in his 55th tournament since capturing his eighth and most recent championship at Brisbane on 10 January 2016.
- In his 15th year on the ATP Tour, No. 18 seed **Gael Monfils** is enjoying the best start to a season of his career. The 32-year-old Frenchman is 15-3 and coming off a 6-0, 6-3 win over **Albert Ramos-Vinolas** and a 6-0, 6-2 win over **Philipp Kohlschreiber**. The going gets tougher on Thursday when Monfils faces No. 7 seed **Dominic Thiem**. Monfils has never beaten Thiem in four meetings, including a 6-3, 6-2 loss in the fourth round of the 2017 BNP Paribas Open. Thiem has as many wins this week as he did in January and February combined (three). He has not dropped a set during the tournament.

EVERYONE IN ACTION ON STAR-STUDED 7TH DAY AT BNP PARIBAS OPEN

- For six straight days, the BNP Paribas Open order of play alternated between the top and bottom halves of the draw. That changes Wednesday when all 16 remaining players battle for berths in the quarter-finals. No ATP Masters 1000 champions remain on the top half, where No. 1 seed **Novak Djokovic** and No. 3 seed **Alexander Zverev** were upset in the third round. Four ATP Masters 1000 champions reside on the other half, led by No. 2 seed **Rafael Nadal** and No. 4 seed **Roger Federer**.
- Opportunity awaits all eight men atop the draw, including three-time ATP Masters 1000 finalists **Gael Monfils** and **Milos Raonic**. Monfils, 0-15 against Djokovic, instead meets **Philipp Kohlschreiber**, whom he leads 13-2 head-to-head. Raonic also faces a German opponent, but it's not the three-time ATP Masters 1000 champion Zverev. It's **Jan-Lennard Struff**, who defeated Zverev on Monday but has never advanced to an ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final. Two-time ATP Masters 1000 finalist **Dominic Thiem** takes on **Ivo Karlovic**, who is 3-0 in matches, 4-0 in tiebreaks and 6-0 in sets as a 40-year-old. More than two decades younger than Karlovic is **Miomir Kecmanovic**, 19. The Serbian lucky loser plays **Yoshihito Nishioka** with a maiden ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final on the line.
- The bottom half of the draw also features a teenager in 19-year-old Canadian **Denis Shapovalov**. The No. 24 seed meets **Hubert Hurkacz**, 22, one day after both men earned the second-biggest win of their respective careers (Hurkacz d. No. 7 **Kei Nishikori**, Shapovalov d. No. 11 **Marin Cilic**). Reigning ATP Masters 1000 Miami champion **John Isner** clashes with **Karen Khachanov** in a rematch of ATP Masters 1000 Paris. On 1 November, the 22-year-old Khachanov saved two match points against Isner en route to the biggest title of his career. TWO FOR TUESDAY: ALL-SWISS, ALL-RUSSIAN MATCHES ON SCHEDULE

- They've won an Olympic gold medal, a Davis Cup championship and 23 Grand Slam titles in total. On Tuesday, **Roger Federer** and **Stan Wawrinka** of Switzerland will share the court again for a much-anticipated third-round match at the BNP Paribas Open. Federer is 21-3 overall, 16-0 on hard courts and 3-0 in Indian Wells against his countryman, including a 6-4, 7-5 victory for the 2017 BNP Paribas Open title. The Swiss have also succeeded on the same side of the court. They won the doubles gold medals at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, beat **Marc Lopez** and **Rafael Nadal** to reach the 2011 BNP Paribas Open doubles final, then teamed up again to lead Switzerland to the 2014 Davis Cup title.
- While Federer and Wawrinka meet for the 25th time, Russians **Karen Khachanov** and **Andrey Rublev** will write the second chapter of their own friendly rivalry. After meeting on the ITF Futures Circuit and ATP Challenger Tour, Khachanov edged Rublev at 2017 Halle in their first head-to-head on the ATP Tour. Like Federer and Wawrinka, the 22-year-old Khachanov and 21-year-old Rublev have fond Olympic memories from China. They earned silver medals in doubles at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games in Nanjing. The Russians went on to reach the 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Miami doubles final.
- Khachanov and Rublev are among the seven players under the age of 23 to reach the BNP Paribas Open third round. Not since 2011 have that many advanced to the Round of 32 in Indian Wells. **Denis Shapovalov**, 19, and **Hubert Hurkacz**, 22, will meet in the fourth round if they each win on Tuesday. The 24th-seeded Shapovalov challenges No. 10 seed **Marin Cilic** and the unseeded Hurkacz meets No. 6 seed **Kei Nishikori**. Shapovalov lost to Cilic in their only prior meeting last fall at Basel. Hurkacz, on the other hand, earned the biggest victory of his career over Nishikori at Dubai on 27 February. Yesterday, the other three players under the age of 23 competed in third-round matches: 18-year-old **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, 19-year-old **Miomir Kecmanovic** and 21-year-old **Alexander Zverev**.

DJOKOVIC, GIRON AIM TO KEEP ON ROLLING IN MONDAY'S THIRD ROUND

- Five-time BNP Paribas Open champion **Novak Djokovic** heads back out to Stadium 1 for his third-round match on Monday against veteran German **Philipp Kohlschreiber**. Djokovic has claimed eight of their nine prior encounters, with three of those wins having come at Indian Wells, including their first-ever clash 11 years ago. Djokovic had a milestone second-round match, as the World No. 1's victory over **Bjorn Fratangelo** gave him his 50th match win at Indian Wells. 2018 Indian Wells quarter-finalist Kohlschreiber has also had a noteworthy event – he beat two Top 50 players in his first two rounds, including recent Acapulco champion **Nick Kyrgios**, who was on a five-match winning streak.
- Ranked outside the Top 200, **Marcos Giron** needed a wild card to get into the qualifying event, but the 2014 NCAA singles champion out of UCLA took full advantage of that opportunity. 25-year-old Giron, who had only one Tour-level match-win before this event, upset Top 40 players **Jeremy Chardy** and **Alex de Minaur** to garner back-to-back wins in an ATP Tour main draw for the first time in his career. Giron will have to knock off an even higher-ranked player in the third round to keep his Cinderella run going: No. 13 seed **Milos Raonic**, the 2016 Indian Wells finalist who is 20-7 at the BNP Paribas Open.
- No. 3 seed **Alexander Zverev** brings a 4-0 record against his fellow German **Jan-Lennard Struff** into their third-round Stadium 1 tilt. Zverev has reached the quarter-finals at ATP Masters 1000 events 11 times in his career (going on to win three ATP Masters 1000 titles) but has yet to reach the final eight at Indian Wells. Meanwhile, on Stadium 2, 18-year-old **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, fresh off his first Top 10 win over **Stefanos Tsitsipas** and at a career-high ranking to boot, will try to reach his first ATP Masters 1000 round of 16. To do so, he will have to get past 5-foot-7 **Yoshihito Nishioka**, who reached the round of 16 at Indian Wells in 2017.

STATS OF THE DAY

- Gael Monfils**'s Rotterdam title last month was only his second singles title at ATP 500 level (of eight singles titles in total). Monfils is still seeking his first ATP Masters 1000 singles title (0-3 in finals at that level).
- Marcos Giron**, who received a wild card into the qualifying field, has now won back-to-back matches in an ATP Tour main draw for the first time in his career.
- No. 217 Giron is the lowest-ranked player to reach the Indian Wells third round since No. 239 **Ivo Karlovic** in 2011.
- 40-year-old Karlovic became the oldest match winner at an ATP Masters 1000 event in series history (since 1990) when he won his first-round match over **Matthew Ebden** on Thursday. He quickly broke his own record two days later with an upset of his countryman, No. 11 seed **Borna Coric**, in the second round.
- Philipp Kohlschreiber** reached his 5th and most recent ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final at Indian Wells last year (his first came at Madrid in 2007). He has yet to reach a Masters 1000 semi-final (0-5 in QF matches).
- In his first-ever ATP Masters 1000 main draw appearance, **Prajnesh Gunneswaran** has reached the third round as a qualifier. It is the second year in a row that an Indian qualifier has made the third round of the BNP Paribas Open – **Yuki Bhambri** pulled off the same feat in 2018.
- Laslo Djere** and **Felix Auger-Aliassime** both contested their first ATP Tour singles final at Rio de Janeiro last month, with Djere winning that match to capture the title. Both now find themselves into the third round at Indian Wells while holding career-high rankings – Djere at No. 32 and Auger-Aliassime at No. 58.
- Seeded players went 11-4 on Sunday. 18 seeds in total reached the round of 32 at this event.

NADAL, FEDERER KICK OFF 2019 INDIAN WELLS CAMPAIGNS ON SUNDAY

- Five-time BNP Paribas Open champion **Roger Federer** plays his first match of the 2019 edition on Sunday when he faces **Peter Gojowczyk** of Germany on Stadium 1. No. 4-seeded Federer completed his quest for his 100th career ATP Tour singles title one week ago when he defeated **Stefanos Tsitsipas** in the Dubai final, and he enters the second round of Indian Wells with an 8-1 win-loss record this season. Federer has reached the final in his last four Indian Wells appearances, winning the title in 2017, and finishing runner-up to **Novak Djokovic** in 2014 and 2015 and to **Juan Martin del Potro** last year. Federer beat Gojowczyk in their only meeting at ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati last year, which was shortly after the German hit his career-high ranking of No. 39.
- Three-time Indian Wells champion **Rafael Nadal** will hit Stadium 1 in the evening session, when he takes on American wild card **Jared Donaldson**. Nadal is playing his third event of the year, following a run to the Australian Open final, which he lost to Djokovic, and a second-round loss to eventual champion **Nick Kyrgios** at Acapulco last week. As for Donaldson, he returned to the tour at Delray Beach in February following six months away due to a right knee injury, and he picked up his first Tour-level victory since July of last year by defeating **Tatsuma Ito** in the first round on Friday.
- Three-time Grand Slam champion and 2017 Indian Wells finalist **Stan Wawrinka** will face a familiar foe in the second round: Wawrinka and No. 29 seed **Marton Fucsovics** met three times last year, with Fucsovics winning their first meeting before Wawrinka claimed two victories in back-to-back weeks later in the season. Another former Indian Wells finalist, 2012 runner-up **John Isner**, will meet 19-year-old Australian qualifier **Alexei Popyrin** on Sunday. After starting 2019 with an 0-2 record, top-ranked American Isner has made the semi-finals of his last three events in a three-week span.

- Second-round opponents **Guido Pella** and **Alex Bolt** are playing each other at career-high rankings of No. 34 and No. 125 respectively.
- Other Sunday competitors at career-high rankings are **Daniil Medvedev** (No. 15), **Marton Fucsovics** (No. 31), and **Hubert Hurkacz** (No. 67).
- World No. 78 **Feliciano Lopez** is at his lowest ranking since he was No. 84 on 16 July 2007.

AUGER-ALIASSIME, 18, AND KARLOVIC, 40, SEEK SATURDAY UPSETS

- One year ago, a 17-year-old **Felix Auger-Aliassime** became the youngest match winner at the BNP Paribas Open since it served as the first ATP Masters 1000 event in 1990. On Thursday, a 40-year-old **Ivo Karlovic** became the oldest match winner at an ATP Masters 1000 event in series history. Unlikely and unseeded, Auger-Aliassime and Karlovic return Saturday for second-round matches against No. 9 seed **Stefanos Tsitsipas** and No. 11 seed **Borna Coric** respectively. Auger-Aliassime and Tsitsipas, both #NextGenATP players, have never met on tour. As juniors, however, Auger-Aliassime went 3-0 against Tsitsipas despite being two years younger than the Greek. Karlovic also owns a head-to-head advantage in his match-up with Coric. The 6-foot-11 Croat is 2-0 against his 22-year-old countryman.
- Headlining on Saturday evening is World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic**, who meets American qualifier **Bjorn Fratangelo** in a rematch of the same tournament and round three years ago. In 2016, Fratangelo took the first set before Djokovic won 12 straight to claim a record-breaking fifth BNP Paribas Open title. **Roger Federer** tied that record in 2017 and nearly claimed it in 2018. The Swiss, who begins his campaign Sunday, held three championship points before falling last year to **Juan Martin del Potro**.
- Also at the 2018 BNP Paribas Open, **Sam Querrey** was one set from breaking into the Top 10 of the ATP Rankings. He lost that set and match to **Milos Raonic** in the quarter-finals, then fell outside of the Top 60 by September. Now ranked 51st, Querrey can avenge his loss to Raonic when they meet on Saturday. If Querrey wins, he will face either No. 23 seed **Alex de Minaur** or 25-year-old qualifying wild card **Marcos Giron** in the third round. Both Querrey and Giron attended Thousand Oaks High School in Southern California. Querrey was in the Top 100 less than a year after his 2006 graduation. Giron, Class of 2011, enrolled at UCLA and captured the NCAA singles championship as a junior.

YOUNG AMERICANS TIAFOE, FRITZ, MCDONALD OPEN CAMPAIGNS

- More Americans are in the Top 100 of the ATP Rankings than any other nationality and three of the United States' rising stars will play in Indian Wells on Friday. **Frances Tiafoe**, **Taylor Fritz** and **Mackenzie McDonald**, who have all achieved career-high rankings this season, are set to begin their BNP Paribas Open campaigns. They are among the 10 Americans in the Top 100 along with **Steve Johnson**, who faces Fritz, 21, on Stadium 1. Later on the same court, Tiafoe meets **Nicolas Jarry** of Chile. On his 21st birthday at the Australian Open, Tiafoe became the youngest American Grand Slam quarter-finalist since 2003. McDonald, 23, is a former NCAA singles and doubles champion who defeated both Tiafoe and Fritz last month. He opens against **Joao Sousa** of Portugal on Stadium 2.
- After meeting in the Delray Beach final on 24 February, **Radu Albot** and **Daniel Evans** earned two wins each to qualify for the BNP Paribas Open. Albot, who saved three championship points against Evans for his first ATP Tour title, meets **Marius Copil** on Stadium 7. Evans was drawn against former World No. 3 **Stan Wawrinka** on Stadium 2 in a rematch of the 2016 US Open third round. Wawrinka saved a match point to edge Evans en route to his third and most recent Grand Slam championship.
- Two of the ATP Tour's most decorated veterans will face off for the 15th time when 37-year-old **Feliciano Lopez** plays 33-year-old **Tomas Berdych** on Stadium 2 (Lopez leads 8-6). Calf, stomach and thigh injuries have limited Lopez to three singles matches thus far this season. Berdych missed the final five months of 2018 due to a back injury, The Czech has rebounded nicely. Already in 2019, Berdych has more victories (12) than all of last year (11). He is one of 10 ATP Masters 1000 champions in the BNP Paribas Open field, capturing his biggest title as a 20-year-old at 2005 Paris.

BNP PARIBAS OPEN STORYLINES

- 30 Years of Masters:** The 2019 BNP Paribas Open ushers in the 30th year of ATP Masters 1000 tennis. Indian Wells is the first of nine elite events each year that unite the top players in the ATP Rankings. It is also one of seven ATP Masters 1000 events that have been part of the series since its start in 1990. The other originals are Miami, Monte-Carlo, Rome, Canada, Cincinnati and Paris.
- Back at his Best:** Last March in Indian Wells, **Novak Djokovic** lost his opener to 109th-ranked qualifier **Taro Daniel**. What a different a year makes. Djokovic returns as the World No. 1 and champion of the last three Grand Slam tournaments and two of the last three ATP Masters 1000 events. Djokovic has not played since winning his seventh Australian Open title on 27 January.
- Roger's Records:** Djokovic and **Roger Federer** are tied for the most BNP Paribas Open titles with five. Federer held three championship points to make it six before losing to **Juan Martin del Potro** in 2018. Recent memories are fonder for the Swiss, who on 2 March won his 100th tour-level title in Dubai. Federer has defeated 50 different opponents for his 100 titles -- 25 of whom are now retired.
- Semi-Fedal:** **Rafael Nadal** is also a five-time BNP Paribas Open champion with three singles and two doubles titles. Nadal and Federer are playing at the same ATP Tour event for the first time since the 2017 Nitto ATP Finals. Federer is on a five-match win streak against Nadal, including a 6-2, 6-3 victory at 2017 Indian Wells. The living legends could meet in the semi-finals on 16 March.
- Historic Start:** **Stefanos Tsitsipas** is 15-5 to begin the 2019 season, highlighted by a win over Federer en route to the Australian Open semi-finals. Tsitsipas, 20, became the youngest Grand Slam semi-finalist since Djokovic, 20, at the 2007 US Open. Though he fell to Federer in the Dubai final, Tsitsipas became the first Greek to break into the Top 10 of the ATP Rankings on 4 March.
- Best of Next:** Three #NextGenATP players are seeded in Indian Wells: No. 9 Tsitsipas, No. 23 **Alex de Minaur** and No. 24 **Denis Shapovalov**. All three youngsters won their BNP Paribas Open main draw debut in 2018. Australian Open quarter-finalist **Frances Tiafoe** is also in the field.
- Nick of Time:** **Nick Kyrgios** was 10-10 in his last 20 matches entering Acapulco last week, where he saved three match points against Nadal and earned three Top-10 wins for the title. Kyrgios could meet Djokovic in the third round after sweeping him in Acapulco and Indian Wells two years ago.
- On the Rise:** Like Kyrgios and Tsitsipas, **Gael Monfils** is in good form as he seeks his first ATP Masters 1000 title. Monfils is 11-2 since 5 February, highlighted by the second ATP 500 title of his career at Rotterdam. The 32-year-old Frenchman also reached semi-finals at Sofia and Dubai.
- Wild Cards:** Rio de Janeiro champion **Laslo Djere** and runner-up **Felix Auger-Aliassime** earned wild cards. Djere beat the #NextGenATP player Auger-Aliassime again in Sao Paulo on 1 March. He is seeded 30th and ranked a career-high 32nd, while Auger-Aliassime is a career-high 58th.
- Doubles Debuts:** The Indian Wells doubles field features eight year-end Top 10 teams and seven duos making their debut. Djokovic and **Fabio Fognini** are among the first-time teams and will face fellow debutants **Jeremy Chardy** and **Milos Raonic** in the opening round. Tsitsipas is also doing double duty, joining forces for the first time with 46th-ranked doubles specialist **Wesley Koolhof**.
