MUTUA MADRID OPEN TALKING POINTS

- 22nd edition on **Mutua Madrid Open** begins on Wednesday with a strong line-up that includes three former champions, **Rafael Nadal** (5), **Alexander Zverev** (2) and double-defending champion **Carlos Alcaraz** (2), who is on an 11-match winning streak at the event. Nadal, who is unseeded in Madrid draw for the first time since 2004, owns the most tournament wins (56) and titles (5) and will face wildcard **Darwin Blanch** in 1R.
- 2022 and 2023 champion **Carlos Alcaraz**, who will turn 21 on the day of the final, bids to become the first player in tournament history to win the three consecutive titles in Madrid. He is 21-0 in Spanish ATP Tour clay events since the start of the 2022 season and will return to action for the first time since Miami against **Arthur Rinderknech** or **Alexander Shevchenko** in the second round.
- Due to withdrawal of World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic**, World No. 2 **Jannik Sinner** becomes the top seed at an ATP Masters 1000 event for the first time in career. The 22-year-old Italian owns a 25-2 record this season, including tour-leading 3 titles on the ATP Tour. He became the only player to reach the semi-finals of all 3 ATP Masters 1000 tournaments this season, highlighted by title in Miami.
- In the 1st clay ATP Masters 1000 event of 2024, **Stefanos Tsitsipas** defeated **Casper Ruud** in Monte-Carlo final, before Ruud avenged the loss in Barcelona final the following week. They will be unable to meet in the final for the third consecutive event as they could potentially clash in the semi-finals. No. 6 seed Tsitsipas is 10-1 on clay courts this season, while No. 5 seed Ruud leads the ATP Tour in wins (29) and finals (4) in 2024.
- No. 3 seed **Daniil Medvedev** will be aiming to complete the box set of quarter-finals at all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events this week, only missing Madrid. On the other side of the draw, 2-time champion and No. 4 seed **Alexander Zverev** (2018, 2021) aims to join **Rafael Nadal** (5), **Novak Djokovic** (3), **Roger Federer** (3) as the only players with 3+ titles in Madrid tournament history.

Daniel Altmaier (GER) vs [WC] Martin Landaluce (ESP)

First Meeting

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 25 | World No. 61 | Career-High No. 47 | 2024: 6-11 (Auckland QF) | Madrid: 3-1 (2024 QF)
 > Made Top 50 debut a day before his 25th birthday in September, achieving career-high No. 47 in October 2023.
 > In 2023, reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at Madrid as a LL and defeated No. 7 Rublev for biggest win of career en route to 7th ATP Tour QF at 2023 Hamburg.
 > Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaquil.
 > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
 > Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R and defeated No. 9 Sinner en route to 2023 Roland Garros 3R.
 > Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

NOTE: Altmaier reached his 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF in Madrid last year and is down to No. 83 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#). The German is 1-5 on tour-level clay this season, defeating Popyrin in Barcelona 1R last week for lone win.

Martin Landaluce | Age: 18 | World No. 322 | Career-High No. 317 | 2024: 1-2 (Miami 2R) | Madrid: 0-1 (2023 1R)
 > Former World No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point in February 2023, broke into Top 500 in November 2023 and reached career-high No. 317 in April 2024 after earning 1st ATP Tour win at ATP Masters 1000 Miami.
 > Made his professional debut at 2022 Alicante CH a week before making his ATP Tour debut at 2022 Gijon as WC.
 > Defeated compatriot Munar for 1st ATP Tour win at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami as WC, becoming the first player born in 2006 or later to win an ATP Masters 1000 match.
 > Owns 9-15 Challenger record, highlighted by run to 1st SF at Tenerife-3 and 27-15 on ITF Tour, winning 1st title at 2024 M25 Vila Real de Santo Antonio in February.
 > Posted a 58-8 record on junior circuit in 2022, including a 15-match winning streak on grass before losing in Wimbledon boys' singles SF, then captured 2022 US Open boys' singles title.
 > Became passionate for tennis at age 1 after watching parents and siblings play, then began competing at tournaments as a 9-year-old.

NOTE: Landaluce seeks 1st clay ATP Tour win and biggest win of his career. He aims to be the 2nd-youngest player to record a match win in tournament history after Alcaraz, 17, in 2021. He earned 1st ATP Tour win by defeating Munar in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 1R in March.

Luciano Darderi (ITA) vs Gael Monfils (FRA)

First Meeting

Luciano Darderi | Age: 22 | World No. 60 (Career-High) | 2024: 11-5 (Cordoba Title) | Madrid: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Former Top 10 junior achieved career-high No. 60 in April 2024 soon after winning 1st ATP Tour title in Cordoba in the third final between two qualifiers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990 (d. Bagnis).
- > Defeated No. 23 Cerundolo for biggest win of career en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2024 Houston.
- > In ATP Tour debut as Q at 2023 Cordoba defeated Gaston for first win, then entered 2023 Acapulco as LL.
- > Owns a 75-56 Challenger record (2-2 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Todi and 2023 Lima 2.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in February 2020 after earning 3 singles and 3 doubles titles to start the season.
- > Born in Argentina, started playing tennis at age 4 with his father Luciano Enrique, a former tennis player and current coach.

NOTE: Darderi looks for 1st ATP Masters 1000 win in second main draw appearance (2024 Miami). The 22-year-old earned 11 of 12 career wins in 2024, including 1st ATP Tour title in Cordoba in February (3-3 vs. Top 50 in career).

Gael Monfils | Age: 37 | World No. 40 | Career-High No. 6 | 2024: 12-10 (Doha SF) | Madrid: 15-12 (2008, 2010 QF)

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 6 in 2016 and married former WTA No. 3 Elina Svitolina in 2021.
- > Owns 12 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500s at 2016 Washington, 2019 Rotterdam and 2020 Rotterdam.
- > Reached at least 1 final in 19 straight seasons (2005-23), including ATP Masters 1000s at 2009 Paris, 2010 Paris and 2016 Monte-Carlo.
- > Earned 552 career victories, highlighted by biggest wins over No. 1 Nadal at 2009 Doha and No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 Indian Wells, as well as career-long win streaks of 12 matches and 25 sets in 2020.
- > Advanced to 2008 Roland Garros and 2016 US Open SFs after winning junior titles at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2004.

NOTE: Monfils is making his 13th appearance in Madrid, highlighted by runs to quarter-finals on both indoor hard in 2008 (l. to Murray) and clay in 2010 (l. to Nadal). He is 7-3 in his opening rounds this season (after 1-2 start) and 9-3 in opening rounds of Madrid.

Facundo Diaz Acosta (ARG) vs [PR] Denis Shapovalov (CAN)

First Meeting

Facundo Diaz Acosta | Age: 23 | World No. 47 (Career-High) | 2024: 12-9 (Buenos Aires Title) | Madrid: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Left-handed Argentine climbed to career-high No. 47 in April 2024 soon after defeating No. 21 Jarry for biggest win of career to earn 1st ATP Tour title in Buenos Aires without losing a set.
- > In his hometown Buenos Aires, made ATP Tour debut in 2020 as a WC, captured 1st ATP Tour win in 2023 (d. Coria) and advanced to 1st SF and final en route to 1st ATP Tour title in 2024.
- > Defeated compatriots Gomez and Tirante to reach 1st ATP Tour QF at 2024 Cordoba (l. to compatriot Baez).
- > Owns 82-53 Challenger record (5-3 in finals), earning titles at 2022 Coquimbo, 2023 Savannah, Oeiras-4, Milan and Montevideo, going 44-17 in 2023.
- > Former World No. 6 junior ended junior career in Buenos Aires by earning singles silver medal and doubles gold medal with countryman Baez at 2018 Youth Olympics.

NOTE: Diaz Acosta is made his Top 50 debut on Monday after reaching Barcelona QF last week (had 2 MPs vs. Tsitsipas in QF). The left-hander seeks 1st ATP Masters 1000 win of his career (0-2).

Denis Shapovalov | Age: 25 | World No. 132 | Career-High No. 10 | 2024: 4-10 (Miami 3R) | Madrid: 6-5 (2018 SF)

- > After becoming 1st Canadian US Open men's singles quarter-finalist in 2020, joined Raonic as 2nd Canadian man in history to break into Top 10.
- > Defeated 2-time champion Murray and earned 5-set wins over Kohlschreiber and Khachanov en route to 1st Grand Slam SF at 2021 Wimbledon.
- > Reached 2019 Paris final and 4 other ATP Masters 1000 SFs, including 2017 Montreal, where he upset No. 2 Nadal and became youngest semi-finalist in series history at age 18 (since 1990).
- > Beat Carreno Busta to begin 2022 ATP Cup final and Kokkinakis to begin 2022 Davis Cup final, helping Canada sweep both team titles.
- > Ended junior career with 2016 Wimbledon boys' singles title, then broke into Top 50 of PIF ATP Rankings less than 15 months later.

NOTE: Shapovalov seeks his first win on clay since reaching 3R of 2023 Roland Garros (l. to Alcaraz). He is 1-4 vs. Top 50 opponents this season (d. No. 11 Tsitsipas at ATP Masters 1000 Miami) and aims to capture his first win vs. a higher-ranked opponent on clay since defeating No. 4 Nadal at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome.

Jaume Munar (ESP) vs Nuno Borges (POR)

First Meeting

Jaume Munar | Age: 26 | World No. 73 | Career-High No. 52 | 2024: 8-10 (2 QFs) | Madrid: 3-3 (2024 4R)

> Finished 2022 at year-end high No. 58 after earning personal-best 19 wins and qualifying for 4 ATP Masters 1000 events.

> Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.

> Earned 2 Top-10 wins over No. 3 Zverev at 2019 Marrakech 2R and No. 3 Ruud at 2022 Tokyo 1R.

> Owns 128-68 Challenger record (9-6 in finals), including recent clay-court title at 2023 San Marino.
