BNP PARIBAS OPEN TALKING POINTS

- Saturday at **BNP Paribas Open** will see the return of 5-time champion and World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden for the first time since 2019. The Serb is looking for his 400th career ATP Masters 1000 win vs. **Aleksandar Vukic** in their first **Lexus ATP Head2Head** meeting.
- Djokovic is also on a 10-match winning streak in ATP Masters 1000 events, capturing Cincinnati and Paris titles last year. On the other side of the net, World No. 69 Vukic attempts to become the lowest-ranked player to defeat Djokovic on hard courts since No. 123 **Jiri Vesely** at 2022 Dubai over two years ago.
- 2022 champion **Taylor Fritz** also makes his debut on Saturday, aiming to join compatriots **Frances Tiafoe** and **Ben Shelton** who booked their third-round tickets on Friday. Fritz reached at least the quarter-finals stage in last three appearances in Indian Wells and faces left-handed **Alejandro Tabilo** in their second **Lexus ATP Head2Head** meeting, with Fritz leading 1-0. The American is 10-1 in last 11 matches vs. left-handers.
- Last year's finalist **Danill Medvedev** faces **Roberto Carballes Baena** in their third meeting. By reaching the final in Indian Wells last year, Medvedev completed the set of finals at all ATP Masters 1000 hard court events and will look to go a step further this year to capture his 7th career ATP Masters 1000 title. Carballes Baena looks for his 2nd Top-5 win of career, after upsetting No. 4 Rune at 2023 US Open.
- On **Stadium 2** and **3**, Top 10 players No. 8 **Hubert Hurkacz** and No. 9 **Casper Ruud** play in their opening round of this year's Indian Wells, while American No. 3 and No. 17 seed **Tommy Paul** faces youngest American in the draw **Alex Michelsen**. Michelsen, who is playing in his first ATP Masters 1000 event, aims to avenge the loss from their 3-hour battle in Delray Beach last month, when Paul won in third set tiebreak.

Taylor Fritz | Age: 26 | World No. 12 | Career-High No. 5 | 2024: 10-3 (Delray Beach Title) | Indian Wells: 18-6 (2022 Title)
> Former World No. 1 junior won 5th ATP Tour title at 2023 Delray Beach to achieve career-high No. 5 and become 1st American in Top 5 since Roddick in September 2009.

> Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.

> Advanced to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2022 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam QF at 2022 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-7 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.

> Clinched inaugural United Cup for Team USA in 2023 after helping Team World capture 2022 Laver Cup.

NOTE: The American No. 1 is making his 8th Indian Wells appearance, highlighted by winning the 2022 title. Indian Wells is his most successful ATP Masters 1000 event with 18 wins (2nd Miami – 9, 3rd Monte Carlo – 8).

Alejandro Tabilo | Age: 26 | World No. 39 (Career-High) | 2024: 10-4 (Auckland Title) | Indian Wells: 5-2 (2023 4R)

- > Toronto-born Chilean achieved new career-high ranking 12 times in 2022, breaking into Top 100 in February and peaking at No. 64 in July.
- > Earned 6 straight-set wins – including 5 over Argentines – en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2022 Cordoba as Q.
- > Defeated countryman Garin en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2022 Santiago as WC and 3rd ATP Tour QF at 2022 Munich as LL.
- > Qualified at Australian Open in 2020 and 2022, earning 5-set win over fellow South American Galan in Grand Slam main draw debut.
- > Represented Canada throughout junior career, peaking at No. 29 in junior rankings during 2015 season.

NOTE: Tabilo came through qualifying in Indian Wells last year to reach 4R, his best ATP Masters 1000 result. The Chilean No. 2 is 1-5 vs. Top 20, defeating No. 14 Schwartzman at 2022 Cordoba SF for lone win.

[1] Novak Djokovic (SRB) vs Aleksandar Vukic (AUS)

First Meeting

Novak Djokovic | Age: 36 | World No. 1 (Career-High) | 2024: 7-2 (Aus. Open SF) | Event: 50-9 (2008, 2011, 2014-16 Titles)
> Record breaking 7-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTA record for most weeks at No. 1 (415), as well as PIF ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (8) and most wins vs. Top 10 (257), finishing in Top 5 in 16 of last 17 years (2017 – No. 12).
> All-time leader for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (24), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).
> Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total of 40 titles.
> Owns 3rd-most men's singles titles in Open Era (98) and 3rd-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1,094) and 2nd-most Grand Slam match wins (366).
> Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (30-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11), ATP Masters 1000-record 31 matches (2011) and Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16).

NOTE: Djokovic is 399-86 in ATP Masters 1000 events, looking to join Nadal (406) as the only player with 400+ ATP Masters 1000 wins since the series began in 1990. The Serb owns the record for most ATP Masters 1000 titles (40).

Aleksandar Vukic | Age: 27 | World No. 69 | Career-High No. 48 | 2024: 2-5 (2 times in 2R) | Indian Wells: 2-2 ('21, '24 2R)
> Broke into Top 200 in March 2020 prior to COVID-19 suspension of ATP Tour, then achieved career-high No. 48 in August 2023 soon after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at 2023 Atlanta.
> Also advanced to ATP Tour QFs at 2022 Adelaide-2 and 2022 Sofia.
> Qualified at 2020 Roland Garros, 2023 Australian Open and ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells in both 2021 and 2023.
> Won Challenger titles at 2022 Bengaluru-2 and 2023 Busan and reached Challenger finals at 2021 and 2022 Champaign, where he was a 3-time All-American for University of Illinois from 2015-18.
> Born in Sydney after parents and older brother fled Montenegro during breakup of Yugoslavia in early-1990s.

NOTE: Vukic looks for the biggest win of his career after earning lone Top 20 win of career over No. 15 Coric at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Toronto. Australians are 4-27 vs. Djokovic, wins by Hewitt at 2006 US Open, Kyrgios at 2017 Acapulco & ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells and de Minaur at 2024 United Cup.

Medvedev showcased a strong offensive performance, increasing his In Attack to 27% from his avg. of 23%. Additionally, his defensive prowess was on full display creating a Steal Score of 54%.

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 28 | World No. 4 | Career-High No. 1 | 2024: 9-2 (Aus. Open Final) | Indian Wells: 11-6 (2023 Final)
> Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.
> Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
> Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
> Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
> Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st career clay ATP Tour title.

NOTE: Medvedev aims to capture the Indian Wells title this year to complete the set of titles at all hard court ATP Masters 1000 events (Miami in 2023, Canada in 2021, Cincinnati in 2019, Shanghai in 2019, Paris in 2020).

R. Carballes Baena | Age: 30 | World No. 64 | Career-High No. 49 | 2024: 4-6 (Auckland QF) | Indian Wells: 3-4 ('19, '21, '24 2R)
> Former World No. 8 junior entered Top 50 at 30 years of age at career high No. 49 after rallying from a set down three times in five matches to win 2nd ATP Tour title at 2023 Marrakech.
> At 2018 Quito, became 1st Spanish qualifier to win an ATP Tour title since Almagro at 2006 Valencia.
> Defeated No. 11 Shapovalov 8-6 in 5th after 5 hours to reach 2020 Roland Garros 3R for 1st Top 20 win and defeated No. 4 Rune at 2023 US Open for 1st Top 10 win in 14th attempt.
> Defeated Goffin for 1st ATP Tour win en route to 2014 Casablanca SF as Q.
> Boasts 233-149 Challenger record (11-8 in finals), including clay-court titles at 2022 and 2023 Seville.

NOTE: Carballes Baena is 1-13 vs. Top 10 players and looks to equal the biggest win of career, after defeating No. 4 Rune at 2023 US Open in 1R for his first Top 10 win in 14th attempt.

Cameron Norrie | Age: 28 | World No. 28 | Career-High No. 8 | 2024: 8-4 (Rio de Janeiro SF) | Indian Wells: 12-4 (2021 Title)
> Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
> Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
> Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.
> Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.
> Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie earned 3 of his 4 career ATP Masters 1000 quarter-finals at Indian Wells (2021 Title, 2022-23 QF) and all four on American soil, also reaching SF at 2022 Cincinnati (l. to Coric).

Lorenzo Sonego | Age: 28 | World No. 55 | Career-High No. 21 | 2024: 4-7 (4 times in 2R) | Indian Wells: 1-3 (2024 2R)
> Earned personal-best 30 wins and achieved career-high No. 21 in 2021, sweeping Cagliari titles to become 1st Italian champion on home soil in singles since 2006 and in doubles since 2005 (w/Vavassori).
> Broke into Top 50 after saving championship point vs. Kecmanovic to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya.
> Did not drop a set en route to 3rd singles title of career at 2022 Metz, including wins over former champions Simon and Hurkacz.
> Upset No. 1 Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to 2020 Vienna final, becoming 1st lucky loser to defeat Djokovic and equalling fewest games ever conceded to Djokovic in a match.
> Saved 1 MP vs. Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF, becoming 1st Italian semi-finalist at Foro Italico since 2007 and 2nd since 1978.

NOTE: Sonego defeated Kecmanovic in 1R for his first Indian Wells win in fourth appearance. The Italian looks for his first Top 30 win of the season (0-6) and first since defeating No. 21 F. Cerundolo at 2023 Vienna.

Michelson had real success with his backhand line drawing errors from the Paul forehand and reducing his Shot Quality score to 6.4 (down from 7.5 avg.). On the backhand cross it was a different story with Paul gaining the advantage and feasting on the backhands through the middle of the court from Michelson.

Tommy Paul | Age: 26 | World No. 17 | Career-High No. 12 | 2024: 10-4 (Dallas Title) | Indian Wells: 7-3 ('21, '23 4R)
> Former World No. 3 junior achieved career-high No. 12 in October 2023 after defeating World No. 1 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF in Toronto earlier in the year.
> Became the 1st American man to reach Australian Open SF in 2023 since Roddick in 2009.
> Owns 6-9 record vs. Top 5, including 3-hour, 26-minute win over No. 5 Fritz to reach 2nd ATP Tour final at 2023 Acapulco.
> Posted upsets at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 events of No. 2 Nadal in Paris 2R, No. 3 A. Zverev in Indian Wells 2R and No. 4 Alcaraz in Montreal 2R.
> Defeated junior rivals Fritz and Tiafoe en route to 1st ATP Tour final and title at 2021 Stockholm.
> Won 2015 Roland Garros boys' singles title (d. Fritz), advanced to 2015 Roland Garros boys' doubles final w/Blumberg and reached 2015 US Open boys' singles final (l. to Fritz).

NOTE: Paul earned 2 of his 6 career Top 5 wins in Indian Wells, defeating No. 5 Rublev in 2021 3R and No. 3 Zverev in 2022 2R. He is 7-1 on home soil in 2024, winning 2nd ATP Tour title in Dallas and reaching Delray Beach final.

Alex Michelsen | Age: 19 | World No. 80 | Career-High No. 73 | 2024: 7-6 (Los Cabos QF) | Indian Wells: 1-0 (2024 2R)
> Youngest American in Top 200 of the PIF ATP Rankings earned career-high No. 73 in January 2024 after becoming the youngest American in Grand Slam 3R since Young in 2007, reaching 3R at Australian Open.
> Earned 1st ATP Tour win and reached 1st QF, SF and final at 2023 Newport, becoming the youngest American ATP Tour finalist since Fritz at 2016 Memphis.
> Defeated No. 9 de Minaur for the biggest win of career at 2024 Los Cabos.
> Owns a 34-15 Challenger record (2-2 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Chicago and Knoxville.
> Reached career-high No. 25 in ITF Juniors, highlighted by 2022 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Gorzny.
> Started playing at the age of 3, hitting with his mother, former college player, every day until 15 years of age.

NOTE: In his ATP Masters 1000 debut, Michelsen defeated Munar in 1R and now looks for second Top 20 win of his career (1-4 vs. Top 20), after defeating No. 9 de Minaur in Los Cabos 2R last month.

> Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
> First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (10), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final), and reach both a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros, US Open, 2023 Roland Garros) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).
> Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.

- > Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (92), finals (13) and titles (9).
- > Defeated No. 4 A. Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final.

NOTE: Ruud is coming from reaching back-to-back ATP Tour finals in Mexico, losing to Thompson in Los Cabos and de Minaur in Acapulco finals. He aims to reach Indian Wells 3R for the 4th consecutive year (2021 4R, 2022-23 3R).

Lukas Klein | Age: 25 | World No. 141 | Career-High No. 133 | 2024: 4-2 (3 times in 2R) | Indian Wells: 1-0 (2024 2R)
 > Broke into Top 300 in 2020 and Top 200 in 2022, then achieved career-high No. 133 in May 2023.
 > Made ATP Tour debut at 2021 Buenos Aires as World No. 291-Q, defeating compatriot Martin in 1R.
 > Played 2021 Tokyo Olympics and made Grand Slam debut at 2022 Wimbledon, before defeating Kwon at 2024 Australian Open for 1st Grand Slam win (l. to No. 6 Zverev in 2R in fifth set tie-break).
 > Opened 2024 season by defeating No. 28 Baez for biggest win of career in Brisbane (l. to Arnaldi in 2R).
 > Owns 95-74 Challenger record (3-2 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Troisdorf, Alicante and 2023 Ortisei.

NOTE: Klein defeated Moreno De Alboran in 1R for 1st ATP Masters 1000 win in his debut and looks for the biggest win of career (0-3 vs. Top 10). The Slovak No. 2 rose 15 spots to No. 126 on the [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#), passing his compatriot Molcan in the live rankings.

Gael Monfils | Age: 37 | World No. 54 | Career-High No. 6 | 2024: 6-6 (Doha SF) | Indian Wells: 18-13 (2016, 2019 QF)
 > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 6 in 2016 and married former WTA No. 3 Elina Svitolina in 2021.
 > Owns 12 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500s at 2016 Washington, 2019 Rotterdam and 2020 Rotterdam.
 > Reached at least 1 final in 19 straight seasons (2005-23), including ATP Masters 1000s at 2009 Paris, 2010 Paris and 2016 Monte Carlo.
 > Earned 546 career victories, highlighted by biggest wins over No. 1 Nadal at 2009 Doha and No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 Indian Wells, as well as career-long win streaks of 12 matches and 25 sets in 2020.
 > Advanced to 2008 Roland Garros and 2016 US Open SFs after winning junior titles at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2004

NOTE: Monfils is making his 15th appearance in Indian Wells, first debuting in 2005. He looks for his first Top 10 win since defeating No. 4 Tsitsipas at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Toronto 2R (35-89 vs. Top 10 in career).

Hubert Hurkacz | Age: 27 | World No. 8 (Career-High) | 2024: 13-6 (Marseille SF) | Indian Wells: 10-4 ('19, '21 QF)
 > Top Polish men's player in history appeared in Nitto ATP Finals in 2021 and 2023 and reached career-high No. 8 in January 2024.
 > Entered 2021 Wimbledon on 6-match losing streak, then reached 1st Grand Slam SF by defeating 8-time champion Federer 6-3 7-6(4) 6-0 in final singles match of Swiss' career.
 > Upset 5 seeds to win 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami title and saved a championship point to win 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai after losing in the 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Montreal final.
 > Also advanced to ATP Masters 1000 SFs at 2021 Paris, 2022 Miami and 2023 Cincinnati and captured ATP Masters 1000 doubles titles at 2020 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime and 2022 Miami w/Isner.
 > Defeated No. 1 Medvedev 6-1 6-4 in 63 minutes to win 5th ATP Tour singles title in 5th final at 2022 Halle (now 7-2 in finals).

NOTE: Hurkacz is 15-1 vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 since last October, only losing to No. 57 Zhang in Tokyo 1R. He is 4-0 in Indian Wells opening rounds, reaching QFs in 2019 and 2021, 4R in 2022 and 3R in 2023.
