Welcome to the Shanghai Rolex Masters, the eighth ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournament of the year on the ATP World Tour to be held at the Qizhong Tennis Center, which was the site of the Tennis Masters Cup from 2005-08. This is a fourth-year ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournament.

The nine ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments bring together the best fields in tennis at the most prestigious venues. This is one of five outdoor hard court ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments (Indian Wells, Miami, Toronto, Cincinnati). There are three on clay (Monte-Carlo, Madrid, Rome) and one indoors (Paris). The ATP World Tour ends with the Barclays ATP World Tour Finals in London, Nov. 5-12. The current top four players of Roger Federer, Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray and Rafael Nadal have already qualified for the prestigious field, leaving four spots remaining.

SOUTH AFRICAN AIRWAYS ATP RANKING POINTS & PRIZE MONEY BREAKDOWN

The South African Airways ATP Rankings are the official rankings in men's tennis, which began on Aug. 23, 1973. Points are calculated from a player's performance in the four Grand Slams, the eight mandatory ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments, four 500 ATP World Tour tournaments and two 250 ATP World Tour tournaments. 2011 ATP WORLD TOUR MASTERS 1000 WINNERS – Last season all nine tournaments were won by the Top 4 players. Novak Djokovic captured a record five ATP World Tour Masters 1000 titles, the most in a season, compiling a 33-2 match record. Nadal was runner-up four times to Djokovic while capturing the title in Monte-Carlo. Murray won two of the last three ATP Masters 1000 titles while Federer won in Paris to close out the year. DIFFERENT ATP WORLD TOUR MASTERS 1000 TITLES

Can it be done? Winning all nine ATP World Tour Masters 1000 titles is perhaps the most difficult task in professional tennis. Andre Agassi is the closest to accomplishing this feat having won seven of the nine different shields. Roger Federer has won seven different ATP World Tour Masters 1000 titles while Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal have six each. Here is a look at the leading multiple ATP World Tour Masters 1000 title winners with total and different tournaments won among active players:

THREE-TIME WINNERS

Last season Novak Djokovic became the first player in ATP World Tour history (since 1990) to win five ATP World Tour Masters 1000 titles in one year. The previous best was Roger Federer (2005-06) and Rafael Nadal (2005), who won four in a season. RACE TO LONDON -- There are four positions remaining for the season-ending Barclays ATP World Tour Finals in London. The winner of Djokovic-Tsonga in Beijing will add 200 points to their total. Raonic will move to No. 10 if he wins the Tokyo title. Here is a look at the 2012 points leaders going into Sunday's finals:

TOURNAMENT PREVIEW

- The eighth ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournament of the year offers crucial points in the Race for London, and 10 seeds in the draw are among the Top 16 points standings. They are in contention for the four remaining berths at the Barclays ATP World Tour Finals, which will be held Nov. 5-12. Overall there are 17 of the Top 20 in the 56-player draw.
- World No. 1 Roger Federer leads the field at the Shanghai Rolex Masters as he brings in a 61-8 match record and six titles on the season. The 31-year-old Swiss superstar will be in his 299th week at No. 1 (as of Oct. 8). Federer will face the winner of a qualifier and Chinese No. 1 Ze Zhang who is coming off a quarter-final in Beijing. Federer could meet countryman and No. 13 seed Stanislas Wawrinka in the third round. In the quarter-finals, Federer could play No. 7 seed Juan Monaco or No. 10 Marin Cilic. Former World No. 7 Fernando Verdasco (vs. Soeda) could play Monaco in round two.
- In the second quarter of the draw, third seed and two-time defending champion **Andy Murray**, who won his first Grand Slam crown last month at the US Open (d. Djokovic in five sets), takes on the winner of Aussie teenager Bernard Tomic and Florian Mayer, a quarter-finalist here last year. In the third round, Murray could face No. 15 seed **Gilles Simon**, who opens with Jurgen Melzer. In the quarter-finals, No. 8 seed/top American **John Isner** or No. 11 seed **Richard Gasquet** are possible opponents. Former No. 1 Lleyton Hewitt plays Radek Stepanek in the first round with the winner to meet Gasquet or a qualifier.
- In the third quarter of the draw, No. 4 seed Tomas Berdych leads the way and he could meet No. 14 seed and Tokyo finalist Kei Nishikori in the third round. The Japanese star defeated Berdych in Tokyo for the third time in four meetings. In the quarter-finals, Berdych could have a showdown with No. 5 seed Jo-Wilfried Tsonga, who is in the Beijing final (vs. Djokovic). Tsonga's first seeded opponent would be No. 12 Milos Raonic, who is in the Tokyo final. The Canadian opens against a qualifier.
- In the final quarter, World No. 2 Novak Djokovic, who is in the Beijing final, opens against the winner of Pablo Andujar and Grigor Dimitrov. The first seed Djokovic could face is No. 16 and top German Philipp Kohlschreiber, who plays American Ryan Harrison in the opener. Djokovic's possible quarter-finals opponents are No. 6 Janko Tipsarevic and No. 9 Nicolas Almagro. Almagro has a tough opener against former World No. 2 Tommy Haas. Tipsarevic plays the winner of countryman Viktor Troicki and Mikhail Youzhny. Former World No. 5 Tommy Robredo takes on a qualifier with the winner to meet Haas or Almagro.

DOUBLES HIGHLIGHTS

• The top eight seeded teams receive a bye into the second round. An outstanding field is led by top seeds and World No. 1 Bob and Mike Bryan, who have won six titles this year and are in Beijing final.



- The Bryans are the winningest team in the Open Era with 81 titles together. They won a record-tying 12th Grand Slam crown at the US Open.
- The No. 2 seeds are reigning champs Max Mirnyi and Daniel Nestor, who defending their Roland Garros title followed by No. 3 Robert Lindstedt and Horia Tecau, finalists at Wimbledon.
- The other seeds are No. 4 Leander Paes and Radek Stepanek, who captured the Australian Open title
 and qualified for the Finals in London, No. 5 Mariusz Fyrstenberg and Marcin Matkowski, No. 6 Aisam
 UI Haq Qureshi and Jean-Julien Rojer, No. 7 Mahesh Bhupathi and Rohan Bopanna and No. 8
 Alexander Peya and Bruno Soares, who are in the Tokyo final.
- There are 1000 South African Airways ATP Rankings points available to the winning team and four positions are remaining for the season-ending Barclays ATP World Tour Finals in London.
