Welcome to the Shanghai ATP Masters 1000 – Presented by Rolex, the eighth ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournament of the year on the ATP World Tour to be held at the Qizhong Tennis Center, which was the site of the Tennis Masters Cup from 2005-08. This is a new ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournament.

The nine ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments bring together the best fields in tennis at the most prestigious venues. This year's field consists of eight of the Top 10 in the latest South African Airways 2009 ATP Rankings and 17 of the Top 20 overall. Five of the seven active players (except Federer, Moya) to rank No. 1 in the South African Airways ATP Rankings are also in the draw – Rafael Nadal, Andy Roddick, Juan Carlos Ferrero, Lleyton Hewitt and Marat Safin.

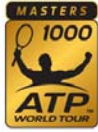
This is one of five outdoor hard court ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments (Indian Wells, Miami, Montreal, Cincinnati). There are three on clay (Monte-Carlo, Rome, Madrid) and one indoors (Paris). The 2009 ATP World Tour ends with the prestigious Barclays ATP World Tour Finals in London. Federer, Nadal, Andy Murray, Novak Djokovic and Juan Martin del Potro have already qualified for the eight-player tournament.

### SOUTH AFRICAN AIRWAYS 2009 ATP RANKING POINTS & PRIZE MONEY BREAKDOWN

The South African Airways ATP Rankings are the official rankings in men's tennis, which began on Aug. 23, 1973. Points are calculated from a player's performance in the four Grand Slams, the eight mandatory ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments, four 500 ATP World Tour tournaments and two 250 ATP World Tour tournaments. The season-ending Barclays ATP World Tour Finals in London will count as an additional 19th tournament for the eight players who qualify. Below is the ATP Rankings points and prize money breakdown:

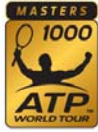

### DIFFERENT ATP WORLD TOUR MASTERS 1000 TITLES

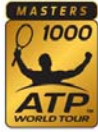
Can it be done? Winning all nine ATP World Tour Masters 1000 titles is perhaps the most difficult task in professional tennis. Andre Agassi is the closest to accomplishing this feat having won seven of the nine different shields. Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer have won six different ATP World Tour Masters 1000 titles. Here is a look at the leading multiple ATP World Tour Masters 1000 title winners with total and different tournaments won among active players:

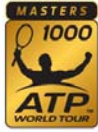

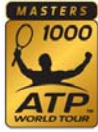

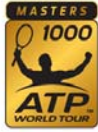

## MAIN DRAW OVERVIEW

- The eighth ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournament of the season, the Shanghai ATP Masters 1000 – Presented by Rolex, features 17 of the Top 20 players in the South African Airways 2009 ATP Rankings, including eight of the Top 10.
- The top seed is World No. 2 **Rafael Nadal**, who is coming off a semi-final effort in Beijing (l. to Cilic). The 23-year-old Spaniard, who ranked No. 1 for 46 consecutive weeks from Aug. 18, 2008 to July 5, 2009, has compiled a 27-4 record in ATP World Tour Masters 1000 tournaments this season with three titles (Indian Wells, Monte-Carlo, Rome). He has a tough opening round assignment against the winner of **James Blake-Ivo Karlovic** and the first seed he could meet is No. 14 **Tommy Robredo** in the third round (Nadal leads 4-0). In the quarter-finals, the Spaniard could face No. 7 **Fernando Verdasco** (Nadal leads 10-0) or No. 11 **Gael Monfils** (Nadal leads 5-1). Unseeded **Lleyton Hewitt** and **Ivan Ljubicic** are also possible quarter-finalists. Verdasco takes on the winner of **Julien Benneteau-Ljubicic** in the second round while Monfils meets countryman **Paul-Henri Mathieu** in the first round with the winner to play Hewitt or **John Isner**.
- In the second quarter of the draw, US Open champion **Juan Martin del Potro** plays the winner of **Jeremy Chardy-Jurgen Melzer** in his opening round. The Argentine could meet No. 16 **David Ferrer** in the third round (tied 2-2). Ferrer has a tough opener with Frenchman **Richard Gasquet** (Ferrer leads 4-1). In the quarter-finals, del Potro's possible seeded opponent is No. 5 **Jo-Wilfried Tsonga** (del Potro leads 3-0) or No. 9 **Robin Soderling** (tied 1-1). Tsonga plays the winner of wild card **Shao-Xuan Zeng** or **Dudi Sela** while Soderling opens with Romanian **Victor Hanescu**.
- In the third quarter, No. 4 **Andy Roddick** is the highest seed followed by No. 6 **Nikolay Davydenko**, who reached the final at last year's Tennis Masters Cup in Shanghai. Roddick, who plays a qualifier or **Stanislas Wawrinka** in his opening match, could face No. 13 **Radek Stepanek** in the third round (Roddick leads 5-1). Stepanek meets former World No. 1 **Juan Carlos Ferrero** (Stepanek leads 2-1). Davydenko will take on the winner of all-Russian first round between **Igor Kunitsyn** and **Igor Andreev** (Kunitsyn leads 1-0). Davydenko is a combined 7-1 against his countrymen. The first seed Davydenko could face is No. 10 **Fernando Gonzalez** (Davydenko leads 5-0).
- In the final section of the draw, No. 2 Novak Djokovic, who won the Tennis Masters Cup last year in Shanghai and has a 25-7 record in ATP World Tour Masters 1000 play this season, takes on a qualifier or wild card **Ernests Gulbis** in his opening match (Djokovic leads 2-1). The Serb could meet No. 15 seed **Tommy Haas** in the third round (tied 2-2). Haas battles countryman **Benjamin Becker** in the first round (Becker leads 1-0). Djokovic's possible quarter-final opponents are No. 8 **Gilles Simon** (Djokovic leads 3-1) or No. 12 **Marin Cilic** (Djokovic leads 3-0). Cilic, who is playing Djokovic in the Beijing final, has a tough first round against **Tomas Berdych** (Berdych leads 1-0). The Cilic-Berdych winner will likely take on **Marat Safin** in the second round. The Russian plays Chinese wild card **Mao-Xin Gong**.



## DOUBLES HIGHLIGHTS

- The top eight seeded teams receive a bye into the second round. An outstanding field is led by top seeds and World No. 1 Daniel Nestor and Nenad Zimonjic, who captured the Tennis Masters Cup in Shanghai last year, followed by No. 2 Bob and Mike Bryan, who were appearing in their 10<sup>th</sup> final of the season Sunday in Beijing.
- The other seeds are No. 3 Mahesh Bhupathi-Mark Knowles, No. 4 Max Mirnyi-Andy Ram, No. 5 Wesley Moodie-Dick Norman, No. 6 Mariusz Fyrstenberg-Marcin Matkowski, No. 7 Bruno Soares-Kevin Ullyett, and No. 8 Lukasz Kubot and Oliver Marach.
- There are 1000 South African Airways 2009 ATP Rankings points available to the winning team and four positions are remaining for the season-ending Barclays ATP World Tour Finals in London.

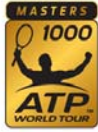

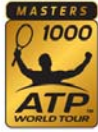

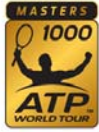
