FEDERER, NADAL RIVALRY CONTINUES FOR 12th CONSECUTIVE YEAR

• FINAL PREVIEW: Two of the greatest players in the history of the sport resume their rivalry for the 12th consecutive year as top seed and six-time Basel champion Roger Federer meets No. 3 seed Rafael Nadal, who owns a 23-10 FedEx ATP Head 2 Head record. This is their first meeting since the semi-finals at the Australian Open last year in which Nadal won in straight sets. The Spaniard has won the last five meetings since Federer's last win came in the semi-finals at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells in March 2012. Nadal has a 9-6 advantage on hard courts and 14-6 in finals but Federer is 4-1 in their previous indoor meetings. Federer is appearing in an Open Era record 10th straight Basel final (6-3) and 12th overall (6-5) in his hometown tournament. Nadal is the first Spaniard to reach the final in tournament history (since 1970) and he's trying to win his second career indoor hard court title ('05 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid, d. Ljubicic).

LONDON FIELD SET: The last two spots were filled on Saturday for the Barclays ATP World Tour Finals with the additions of David Ferrer and Kei Nishikori. They joined: Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray, Roger Federer, Stan Wawrinka, Rafael Nadal and Tomas Berdych in the prestigious year-end tournament. Nadal moved to No. 5 in the Race after his SF win in Basel. Here are the updated standings going into Sunday:

EMIRATES ATP DOUBLES RACE TO LONDON UPDATE: The Top 8 teams in the Emirates ATP Doubles Race to London on Nov. 9 will qualify for the Barclays ATP World Tour Finals Nov. 15-22. Five teams are vying for one vacant spot, with the eighth and final qualifiers to be determined during ATP Masters 1000 Paris next week. No. 9 Peya-Soares are in Sunday's final in Basel and they could close the gap to 125 points if they win the title:

- No. 1 Swiss and 6-time Basel champion beat Kukushkin 61 62 in 1R, Kohlschreiber 64 46 64 in 2R, No. 8 Goffin 63 36 61 and Sock 63 64 to advance to his 10th straight hometown final (6-3) and 12th overall (6-5)
- This week has won 42 of 46 service games (91%) and was broken twice by Goffin on Friday
- Owns a 5-4 record in finals this season with all 4 losses to Djokovic: ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells, ATP Masters 1000 Rome, Wimbledon and US Open. Has an 87-46 career record in finals, third-most titles in Open Era behind Jimmy Connors (109) and Ivan Lendl (94)
- At US Open, became oldest Grand Slam finalist since 35-year-old Agassi at 2005 US Open. Entered US Open final having won 28 straight sets overall, tied for 3rd-longest streak of career
- Won his 7th Cincinnati title and 24th ATP Masters 1000 crown overall (d. No. 2 Murray and No. 1 Djokovic)
- Also won 7th Dubai title (d. Djokovic) and 8th Halle title (d. Seppi), along with maiden titles at Brisbane (d. Raonic) and Istanbul (d. Cuevas)
- Win over Raonic in Brisbane final was 1,000th victory of ATP career, making him 1 of only 3 players to reach 1,000 singles wins in Open Era (Connors 1,254; Lendl 1,071; Federer 1,053)
- At other Grand Slams, reached Roland Garros QF (I. to Wawrinka) and Australian Open 3R (I. to Seppi), matching earliest exit of career in Melbourne (also 2000 and 2001 3R)

- No. 1 Spaniard is appearing in his first career ATP World Tour final on Swiss soil after defeating Rosol 16 75 76(4) in 1R, Dimitrov 64 46 63 in 2R, No. 7 Cilic 46 63 63 in QF and No. 5 Gasquet 64 76(7). Came in with a 3-12 record this yr. when losing first set (has two wins so far). He is first Spaniard to reach singles final in tournament history (since 1970)
- This week has been broken 12 times (held 43 of 55 service games, 78%), saving 20 of 32 break pts. (63%) while breaking opponents 15 of 55 return games (27%), converting 15 of 34 break pts. (44%)
- Has 762 career match wins, which is tied 9th place on Open Era list with 14-time Slam champ Pete Sampras
- Appearing in sixth final of season (3-2) and captured titles at Buenos Aires (d. Monaco), Stuttgart (d. Troicki) and Hamburg (d. Fognini) while also reaching finals at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid (l. to No. 3 Murray) and Beijing (l. to No. 1 Djokovic). Has a 67-30 career record in ATP World Tour level finals (1-4 on indoor hard)
- Denied a 10th Roland Garros title by No. 1 Djokovic in QF, falling to 70-2 lifetime on Parisian clay
- Reached Australian Open QF (I. to No. 7 Berdych), Wimbledon 2R (I. to No. 102 Brown) and US Open 3R (I. to Fognini after leading 2 sets to 0)
- Earned 300th career ATP Masters 1000 win over No. 4 Wawrinka in Shanghai QF (I. to Tsonga in SF)
- Failed to win at least 1 Grand Slam title in a season for 1st time since 2004

Peya/Soares Lead 5-1

- No. 3 seeds **Jamie Murray and John Peers** takes on unseeded **Alexander Peya and Bruno Soares** in Sunday's doubles championship
- The Brit and Aussie are 111-62 lifetime as a team with a 6-9 record in finals (2-5 in 2015). They reached Grand Slam finals this year at Wimbledon (I. to Rojer/Tecau) and US Open (I. to Herbert/Mahut). They were finalists last Sunday in Vienna (I. to Kubot/Melo). Their titles this season have come in Brisbane and Hamburg
- Murray owns a 13-14 record in finals, including 2-1 with younger brother A. Murray (2010 Valencia title, 2011 Tokyo title, 2006 Bangkok runners-up)
- Peers has reached 15 ATP World Tour finals all with J. Murray (6-9).
- The Austrian and Brazilian have a career record of 149-73 as a tandem with a 5-12 record in finals (1-1 in 2015). They won the title in Munich in May (d. Zverev brothers) and were finalists in Stuttgart (l. to Bopanna-Mergea) in June
- Peya has a 13-20 career record in ATP World Tour finals while Soares has a record of 19-20 in finals
- Peya and Soares are 325 points behind No. 8 Bopanna/Mergea for the eighth and final spot for the Barclays ATP World Tour Finals. With a title they will move within 125 points going into Paris-Bercy this week
